## COVID-19 Prevention Tips



### WASH

Wash your hands frequently using soap for at least 20 seconds or sanitise them using alcohol-based handrub.



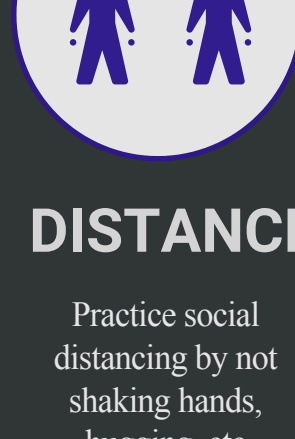
### COVER

Practice social distancing by not shaking hands, hugging, etc.

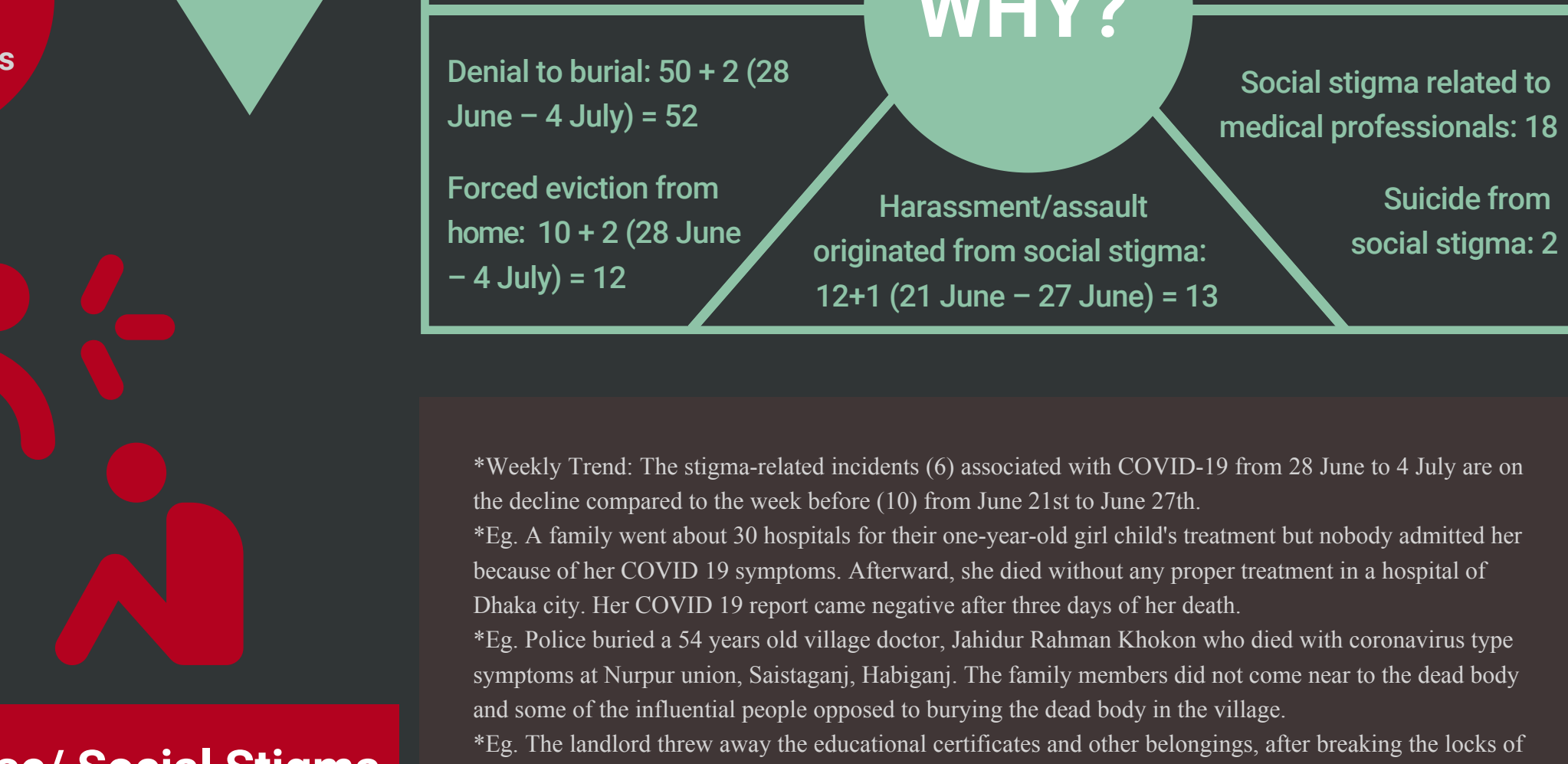


### ISOLATE

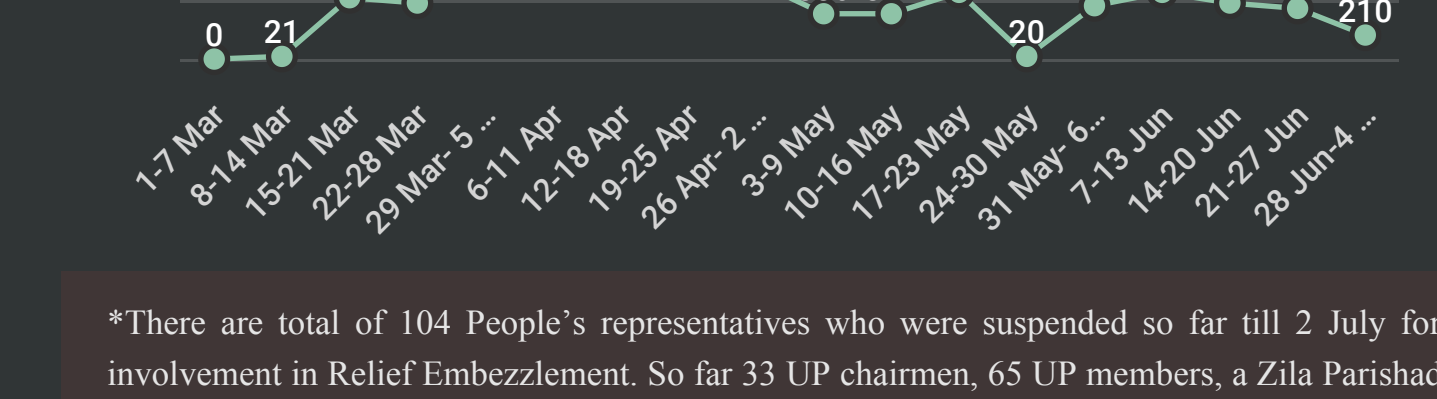
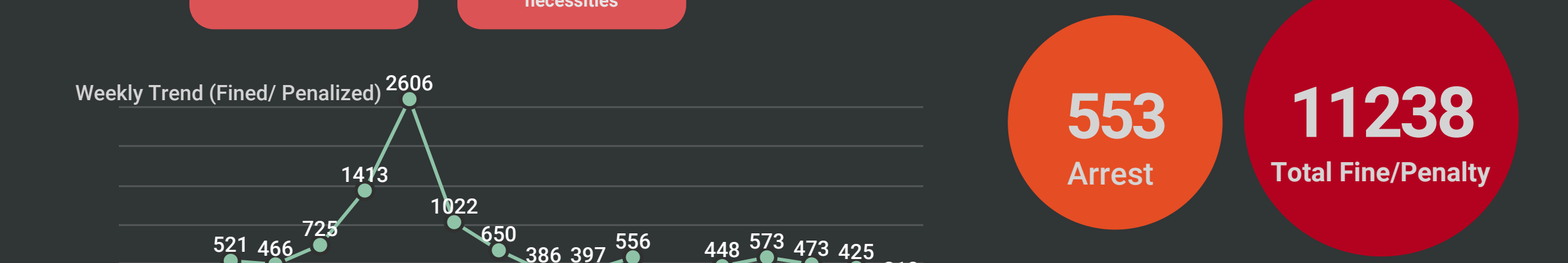

## Verbal Abuse/ Social Stigma

\*Weekly Trend: The stigma-related incidents (6) associated with COVID-19 from 28 June to 4 July are on the decline compared to the week before (10) from June 21st to June 27th.  
 \*Eg. A family went about 30 hospitals for their one-year-old girl child's treatment but nobody admitted her because of her COVID 19 symptoms. Afterward, she died without any proper treatment in a hospital of Dhaka city. Her COVID 19 report came negative after three days of her death.  
 \*Eg. Police buried a 54 years old village doctor, Jahidur Rahman Khokon who died with coronavirus type symptoms at Nurpur union, Saistaganj, Habiganj. The family members did not come near to the dead body and some of the influential people opposed to burying the dead body in the village.  
 \*Eg. The landlord threw away the educational certificates and other belongings, after breaking the locks of the rooms of eight students, in the dustbin for not getting the house rent for three months at a student hostel in Western Street under Kalabagan thana of Dhaka capital city.

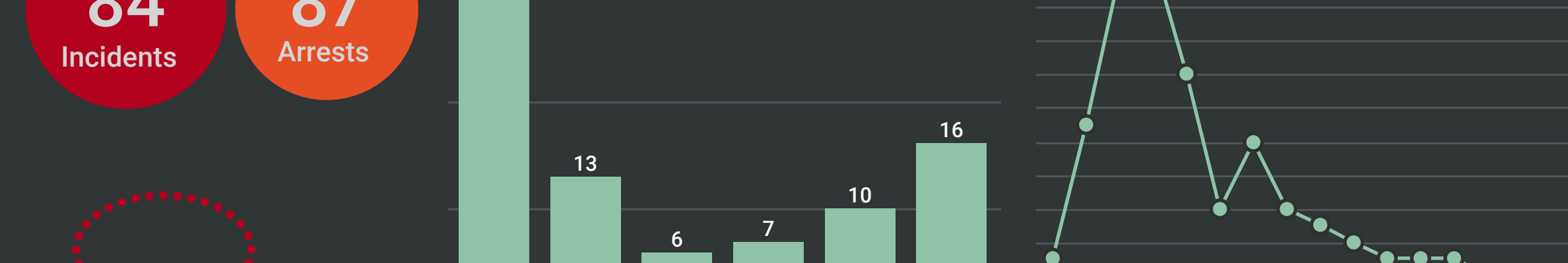


**553 Arrest**

\*There are total of 104 People's representatives who were suspended so far till 2 July for involvement in Relief Embezzlement. So far 33 UP chairmen, 65 UP members, a Zila Parishad member, four municipality councilors and a Upazila vice-chairman have been suspended.  
 \* At least 210 were reportedly fined/penalized and 9 people were arrested all over Bangladesh during 28 June-4 July 2020. Most of the fine and penalty were accounted for the violation of health and safety regulations public, increasing prices and selling fake health care commodities.

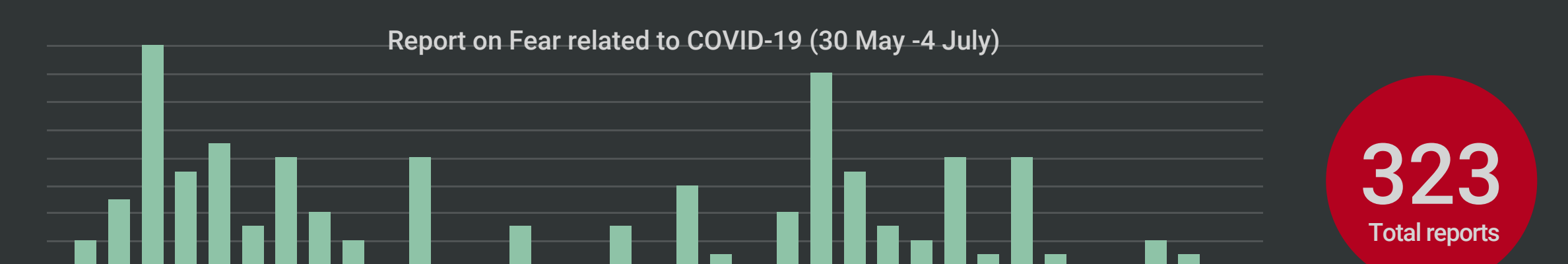
## Division wise Rumor Related Arrests

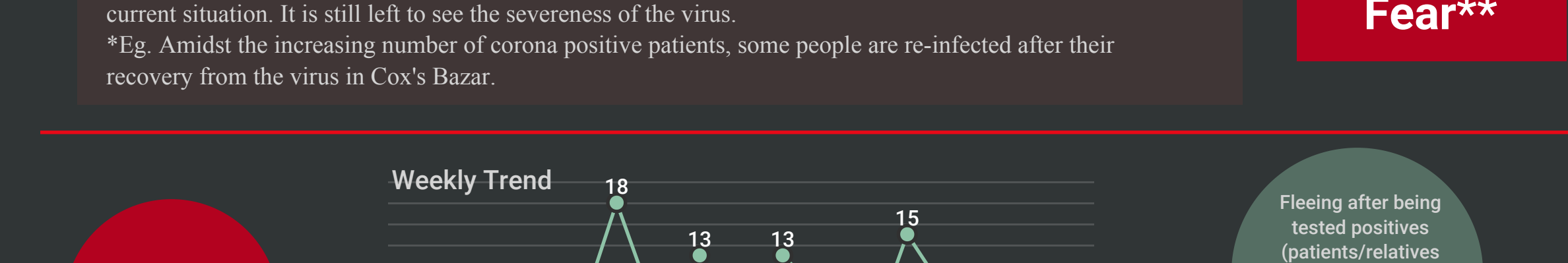
## Report on Fear related to COVID-19 (30 May - 4 July)



\*\* Media coverage of COVID-19 pandemic which evokes fear in the minds of the people.  
 \*Eg. It is alarming that if the corona testing fee is increased, people would certainly avoid the corona testing which ultimately paves the way to spread the virus. Already 30 million new poor have added due to corona pandemic.  
 \*Eg. Health Directorate has confirmed that, in the last 24 hours, Bangladesh has witnessed another record for the highest corona positive death cases-64 (in a single day).  
 \*Eg. World Health Organization said the pandemic is not ending soon. It will take more time to end this current situation. It is still left to see the severeness of the virus.  
 \*Eg. Amidst the increasing number of corona positive patients, some people are re-infected after their recovery from the virus in Cox's Bazar.

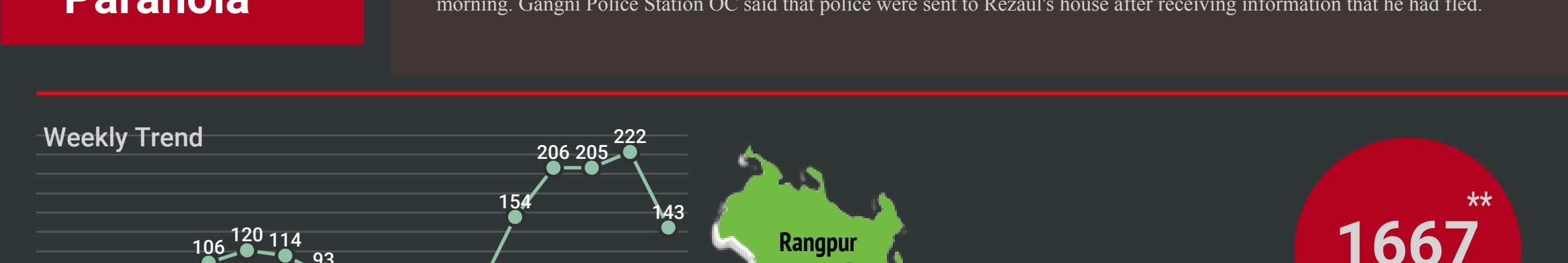


\*\* Media coverage of someone's mental condition related to COVID-19 pandemic.  
 \*Eg. A suspected COVID-19 patient who was undergoing treatment with coronavirus like symptoms at the isolation unit of Jashore General Hospital fled from the hospital.  
 \*Eg. A man named Rezaul Haque (50) ran away from home in Gangni of Meherpur. He fled the house on Monday (22 June) morning. Gangni Police Station OC said that police were sent to Rezaul's house after receiving information that he had fled.

\*Eg. Global Biotech Company Limited claimed that they became successful for making the COVID-19 vaccine on 1 July 2020 in a press conference. At first, they experimented the vaccine to animal which was effective without any negative reaction. They will start the clinical trial on human body soon.  
 \*Eg. The Leading University of Sylhet waived special fees (transport and lab fees) of the students.  
 \*Eg. Members of Bangladesh Army distributed necessary food products among 350 indigent families of remote area in Panchhari, Khagrachhari.  
 \*Eg. A businessman provided 25,000 Tk. To the Gausia Committee to help them in the process of corona patient's last rite in Boalkhali, Chattogram.  
 \*Eg. A Volunteer group of youth "Oxygen for Life Bangladesh" is providing oxygen to the patients with breathing problem in Chattogram.

## Protests Associated with COVID-19 (26 April - 4 July)

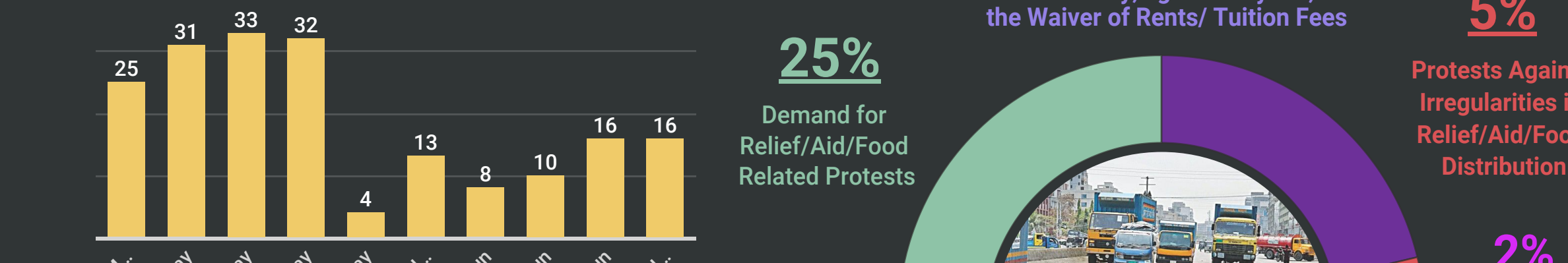


**25%** Demand for Relief/Aid/Food Related Protests  
**6%** Protests demanding better treatment and proper medical equipment  
**4%** Protest against Hike in Bus fares  
**21%** Protests over Lockdown Rules, for Accountability, against Lay-off, for the Waiver of Rents/ Tuition Fees  
**5%** Protests Against Irregularities in Relief/Aid/Food Distribution  
**2%** Protest against proposed budget  
**37%** Protests for Unpaid Salaries and Eid Bonuses

## Protest

\*Weekly Trend: Protests against the closure of jute mills (12) was the dominant type from 28 June to 4 July; followed by protests against mismanagement in the health sector/demand for better treatment and proper medical equipment (4). Overall, the protests associated with the COVID-19 pandemic were steady (16) last week compared to the previous week from 21 June to the 27 June (16).  
 \*Eg. Laborers of Jute mills protested for the decision of the closing of jute mills at Abhaynagar upazila of Jashore district.  
 \*Eg. Play Pen School, an English medium school in Dhaka, has blocked students from accessing online classes after they failed to pay fees amid the coronavirus outbreak. The school authorities acknowledged that they blocked these students from taking part in the classes from 18 Jun. Four days after the opening of online services. The parents held a peaceful protest in the Bashundhara residential area and demanded to reduce the 50% of monthly fees.  
 \*Eg. Workers Party of Bangladesh (WPB) protested and formed a human chain against the government for having mismanagement and corruption in the health sector. Besides this, they have also demanded proper testing equipment for COVID-19 testing in different Upazilas and districts equally in front of Press Club of Dhaka capital city.

## Violent Incident Related with COVID-19 (1 March - 4 July 2020)

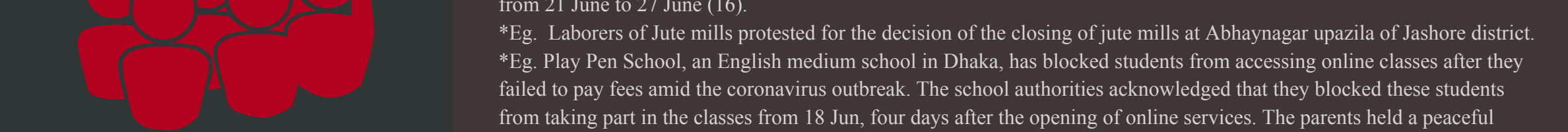


\*Eg. A group of goons attacked on the relief delivery team, looted the reliefs and vandalized the office of the Mongla Port Laborer Association at Mongla, Bagerhat. The laborers detained the leader of the goon gang and handed over to the police.  
 \*Eg. A youth (Md. Siam, 18) and his cohorts allegedly attacked an ASI of police while advised maintaining the lockdown at Rugganj union after violating the 'Red Zone'. Police arrested the accused from Rugganj upazila of Narayanganj district.  
 \*Eg. A youth (Shan Hossain) was allegedly beaten by the Ansar member following a scuffle over not getting chance for corona testing for his cancer patient mother even after standing in the queue from dawn at Mujiga General Hospital of Dhaka capital city. During this time, two journalists were even harassed by the Ansar member while taking photo of this incident.
