COVID-19 Prevention Tips



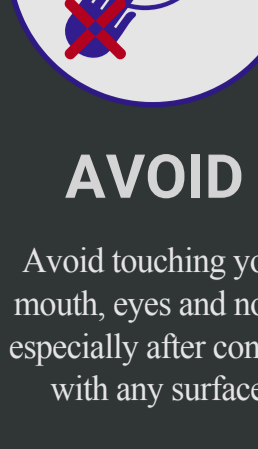
WASH

Wash your hands frequently using soap for at least 20 seconds or sanitize them using alcohol-based handrub.



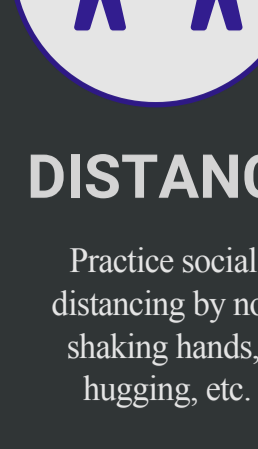
COVER

Practice social distancing by not shaking hands, hugging, etc.



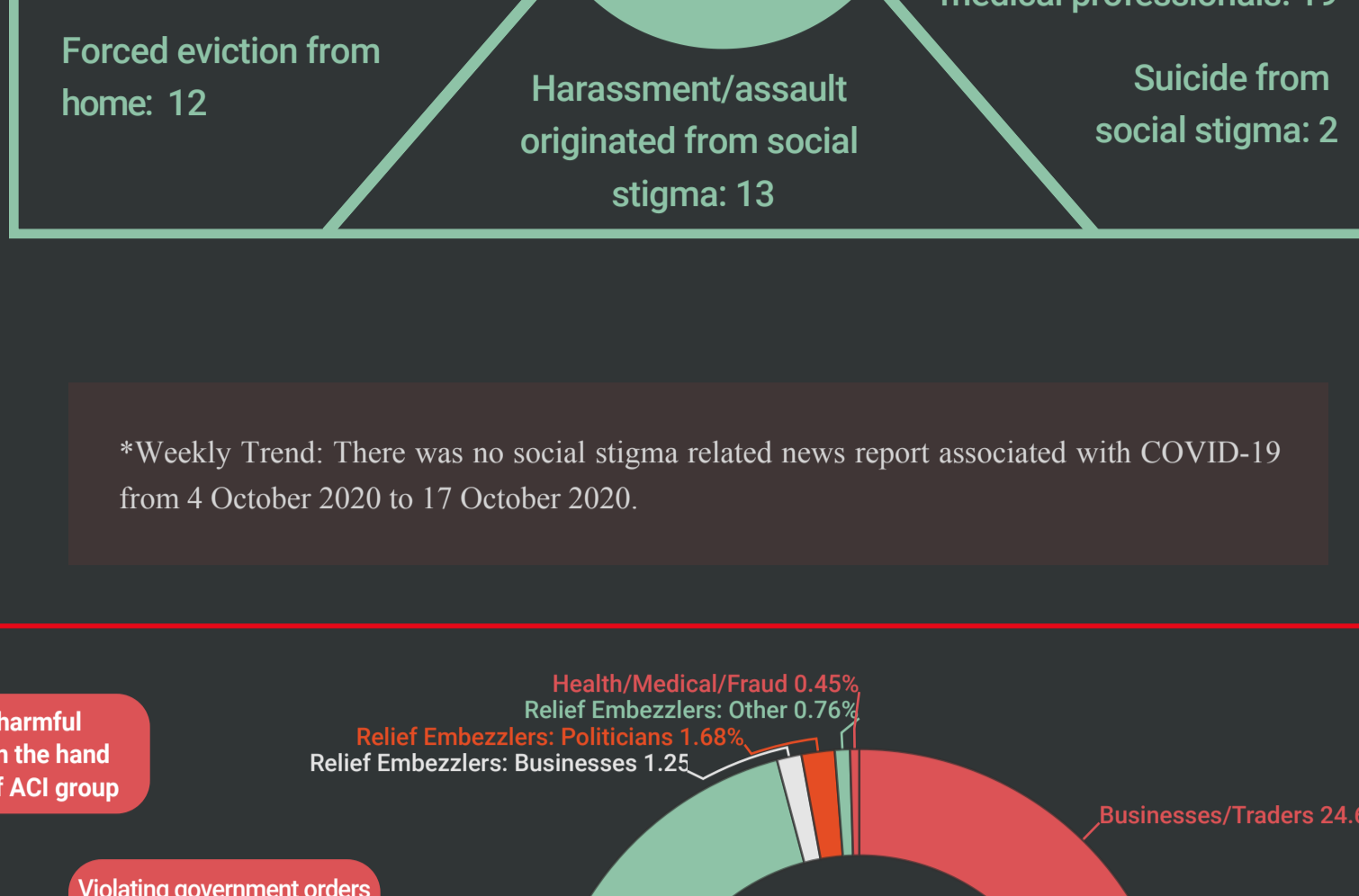
ISOLATE

Update: 1 March - 17 October 2020

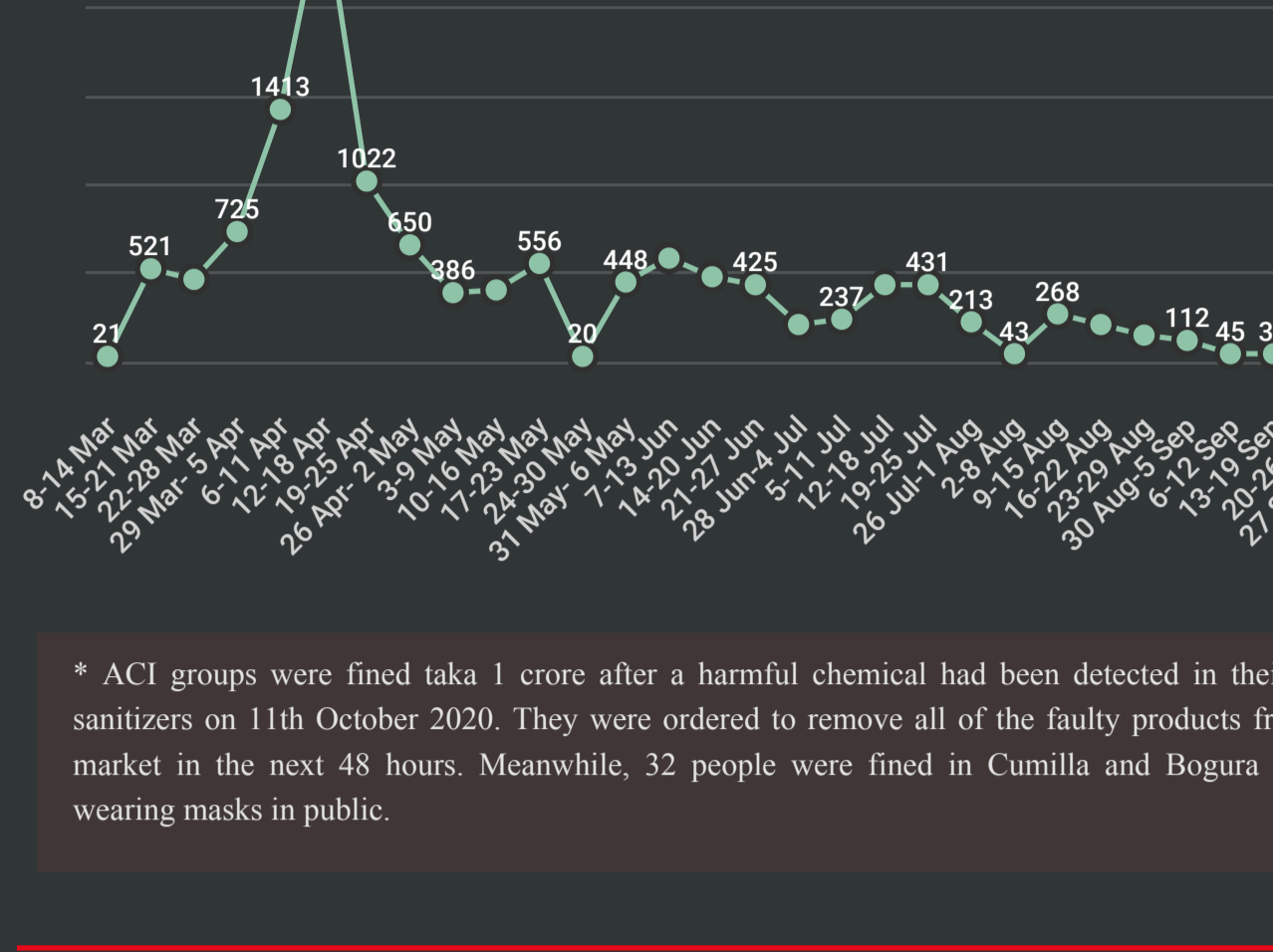

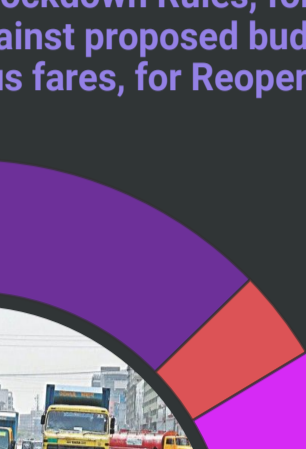

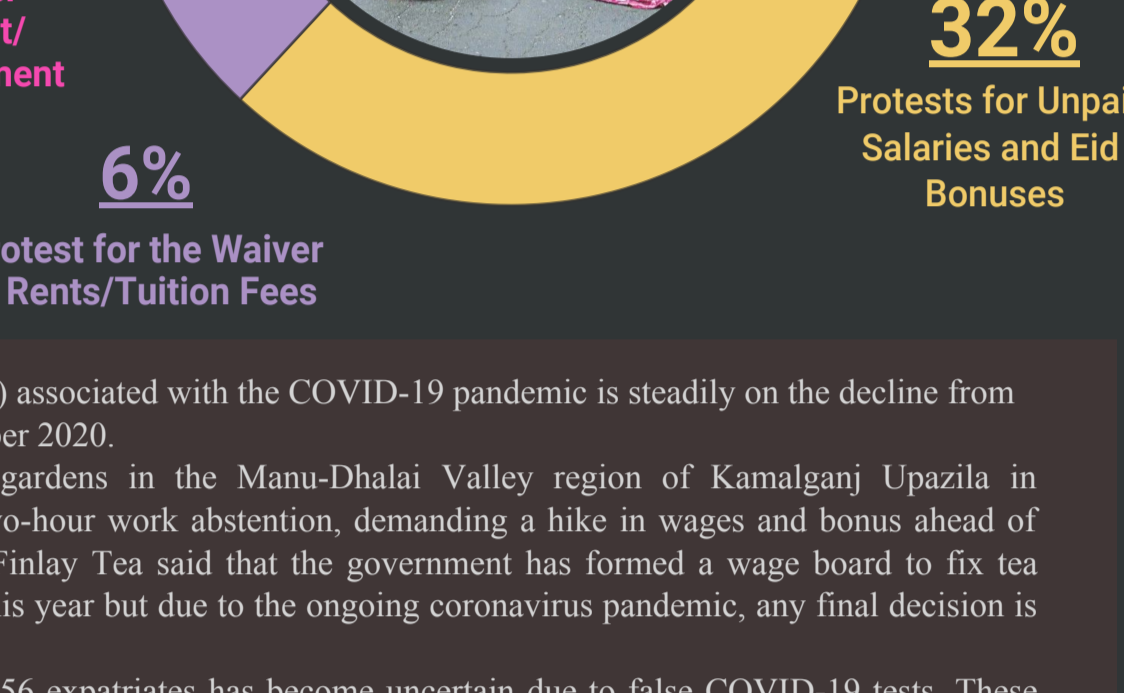

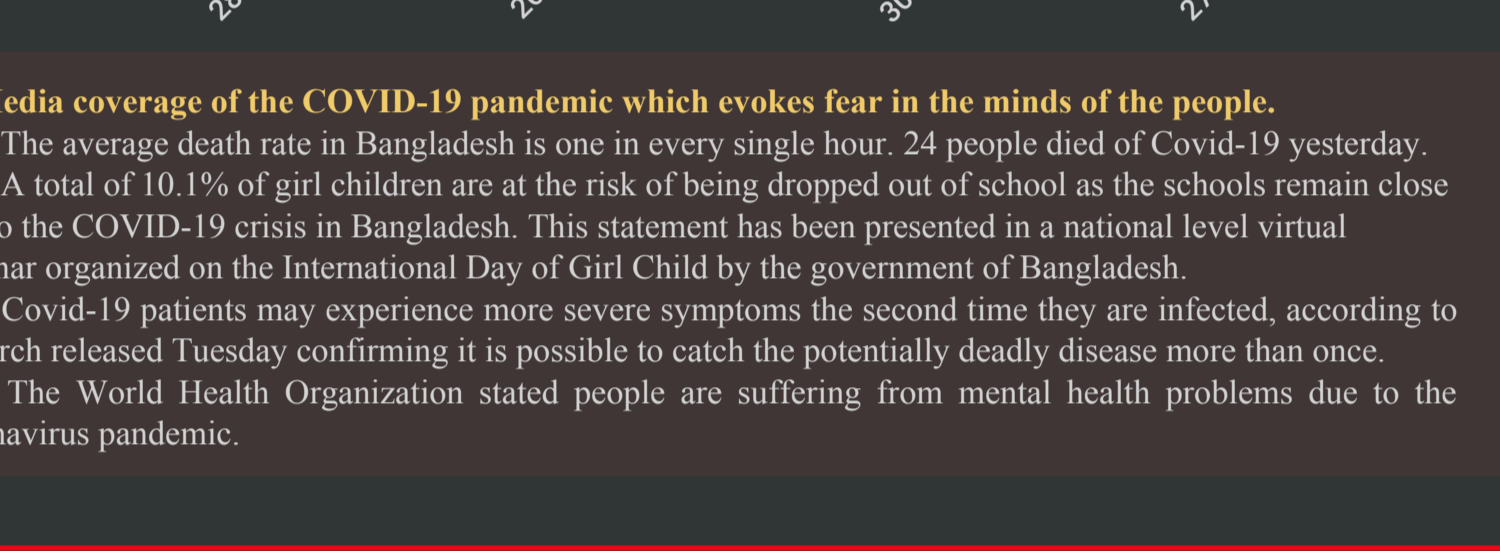
*Weekly Trend: Protests (3) associated with the COVID-19 pandemic is steadily on the decline from 4 October 2020 to 17 October 2020.

*Eg. Workers of 23 tea gardens in the Manu-Dhalai Valley region of Kamalajni Upozila in Moulovibazar observed a two-hour work abstention, demanding a hike in wages and bonus ahead of Durga Puja. The CEO of Finlay Tea said that the government has formed a wage board to fix tea workers' wages in March this year but due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, any final decision is yet to come.

*Eg. The foreign travel of 56 expatriates has become uncertain due to false COVID-19 tests. These passengers committed in front of the Civil Service office in Sylhet.

*Eg. Central Committee of all kindergarten schools demanded the opening of schools maintaining the health guidelines. Otherwise, the committee warned that they will opt for a hunger strike in a seminar organized in National Press Club at Shahbagh, Dhaka.

This statement has been presented in a national level virtual seminar organized on the International Day of Girl Child by the government of Bangladesh.

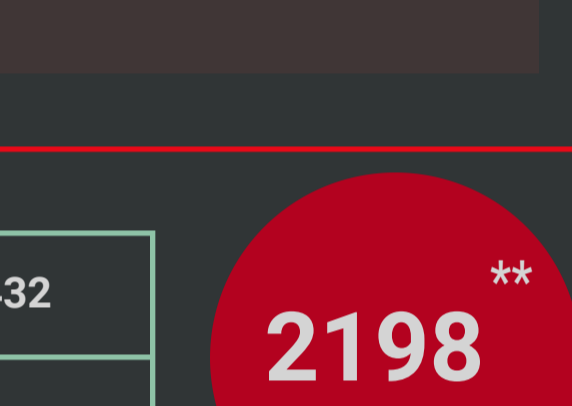
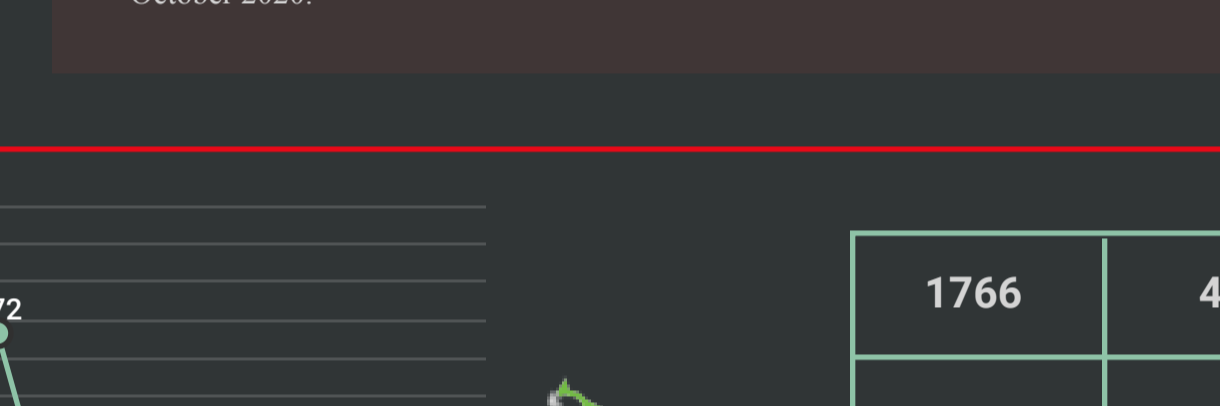

*Eg. Interior designing firm KC's design director Kawzar Chowdhury has donated a high-tech air disinfecting gadget to Kurmitola General Hospital. The machine disinfects its surrounding air and surfaces from any kind of virus or bacteria, including the COVID-19 virus. It is one of the most effective solutions by far for indoor environments.

*Eg. Deputy Commissioner of Barguna District donated an auto-rickshaw to a former van driver who recently became jobless amid COVID-19 at Barguna Sadar Upazila, Barguna.

*Eg. Lions' Club along with Royal Eye Hospital gave free eye check-up, free diabetes check-up, free medicines, and free masks among disadvantaged people in the city town of Chattogram district.

*Eg. Local drug firm Globe Biotech on 14 October 2020, reached an agreement with the ICDDR,B for conducting human trials of its COVID-19 vaccine. ICDDR,B, however, would require permission from the Bangladesh Medical Research Council before conducting the trial.

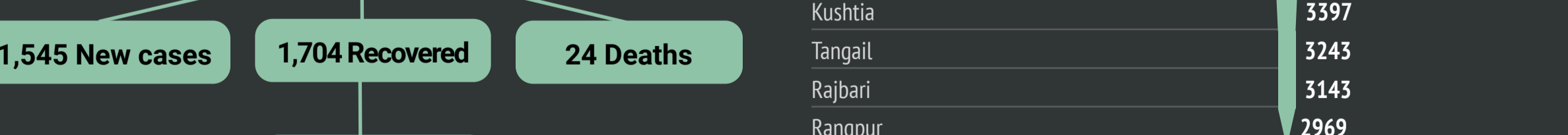
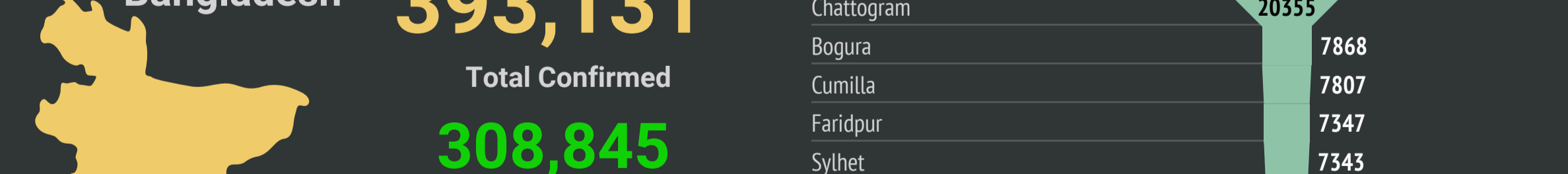
