WASH

Wash your hands frequently using soap for at least 20 seconds or sanitise them using alcohol-based handrub.



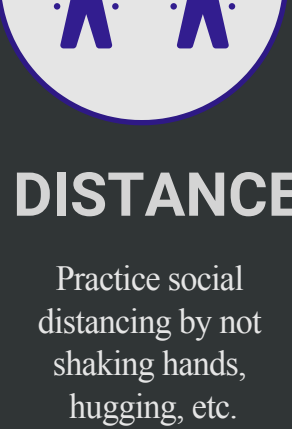
COVER

Practice social distancing by not shaking hands, hugging, etc.

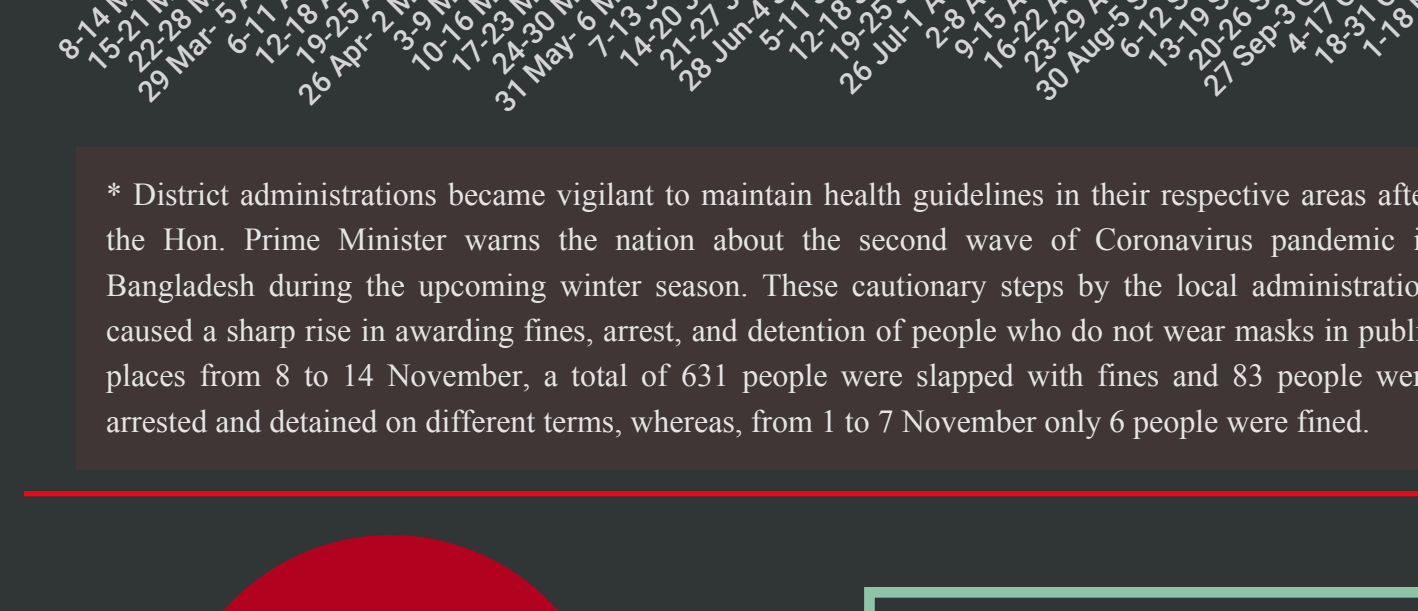
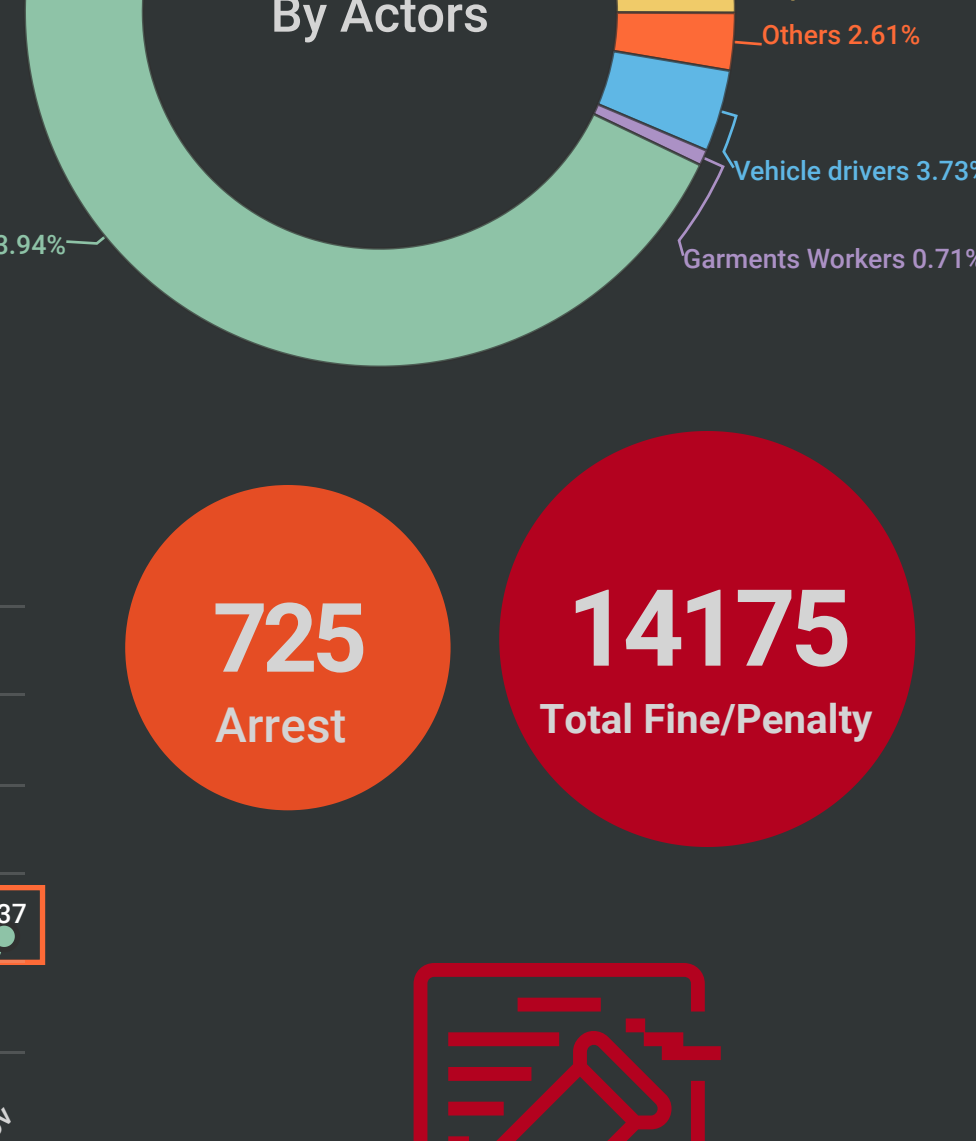
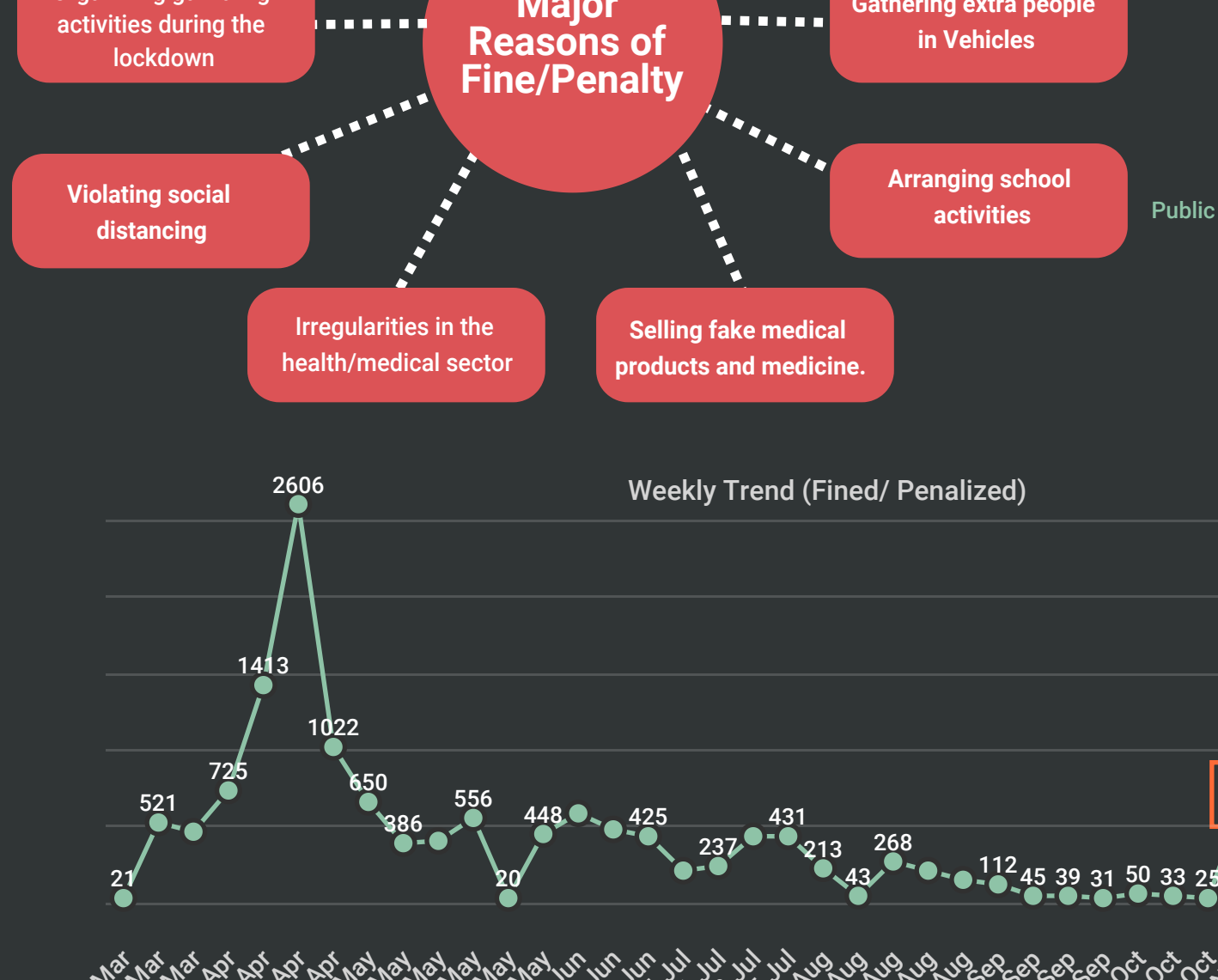


ISOLATE

Covid-19 Related Incident Mapping in Bangladesh

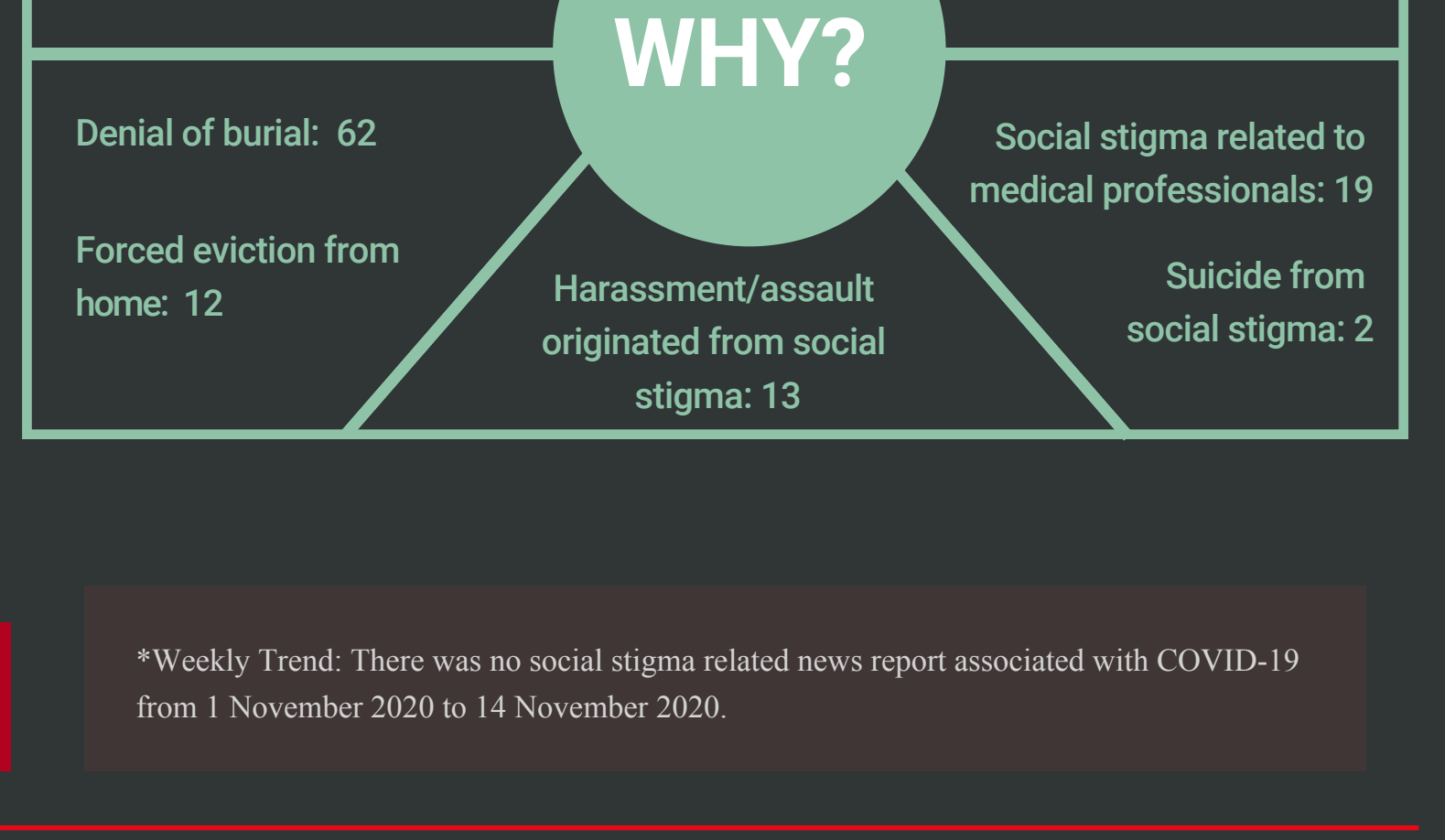

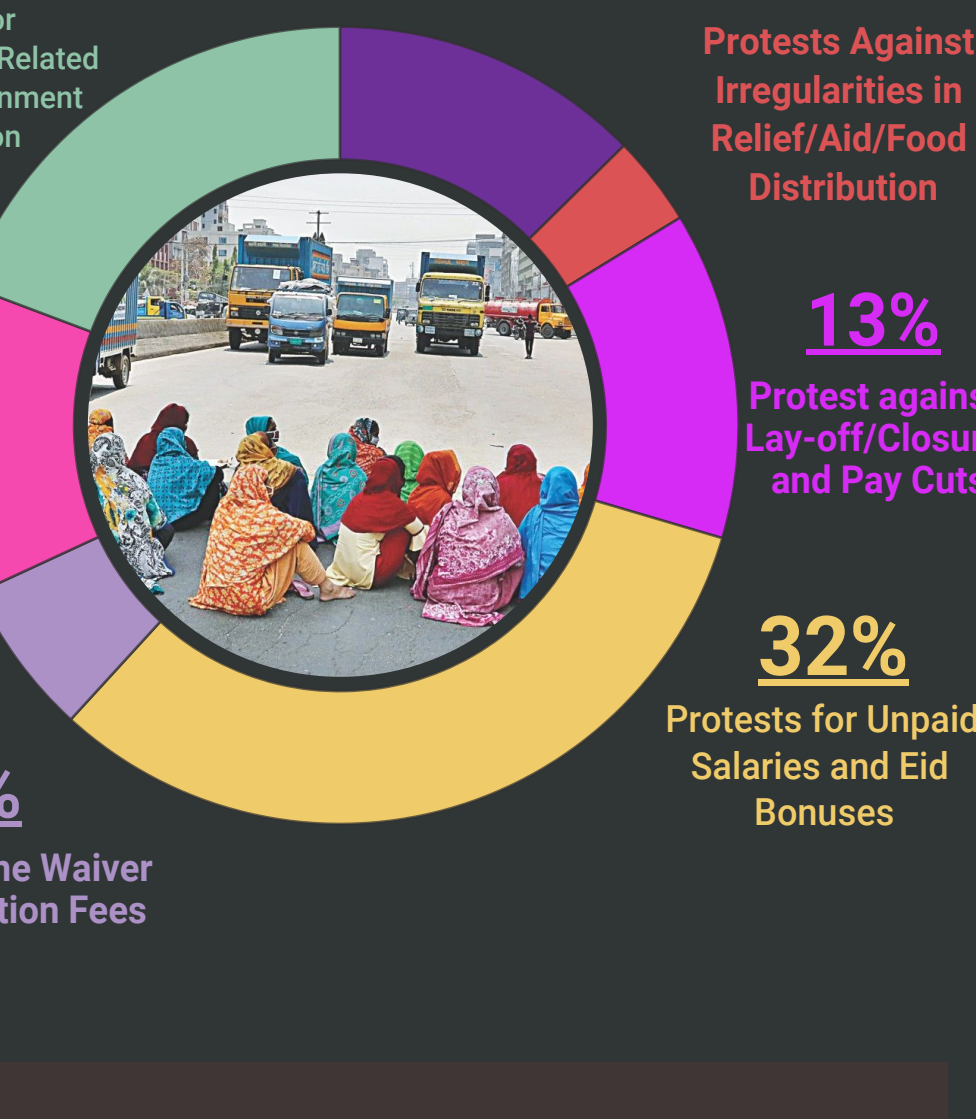
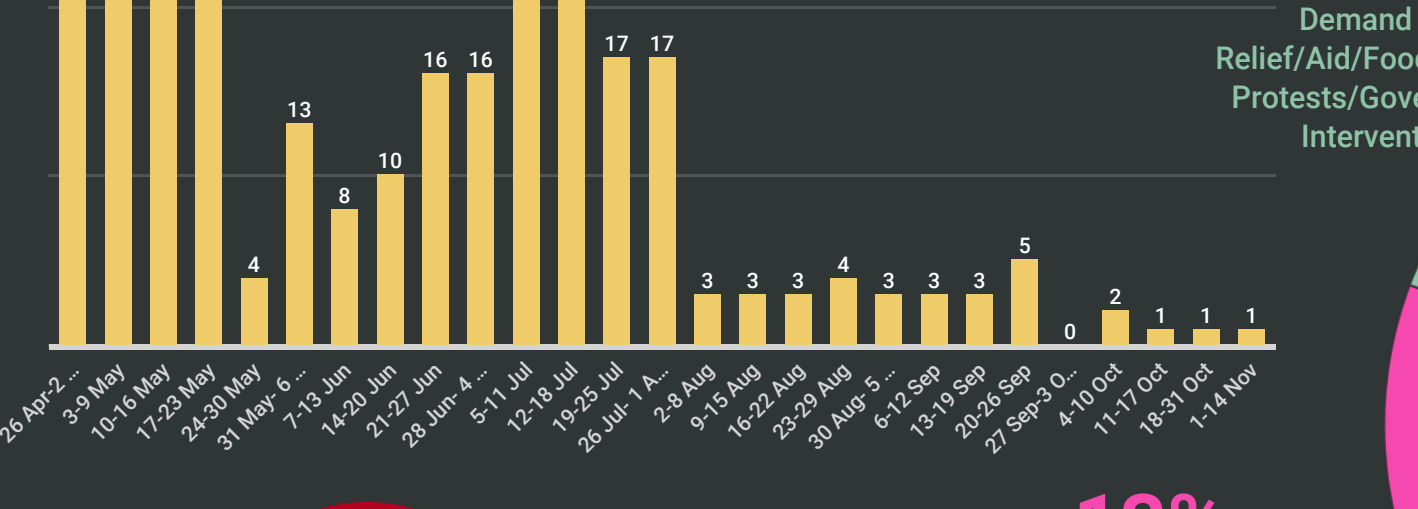
* District administrations became vigilant to maintain health guidelines in their respective areas after the Hon. Prime Minister warns the nation about the second wave of Coronavirus pandemic in Bangladesh during the upcoming winter season. These cautionary steps by the local administration caused a sharp rise in awarding fines, arrest, and detention of people who do not wear masks in public places from 8 to 14 November, a total of 631 people were slapped with fines and 83 people were arrested and detained on different terms, whereas, from 1 to 7 November only 6 people were fined.

*Weekly Trend: There was no social stigma related news report associated with COVID-19 from 1 November 2020 to 14 November 2020.

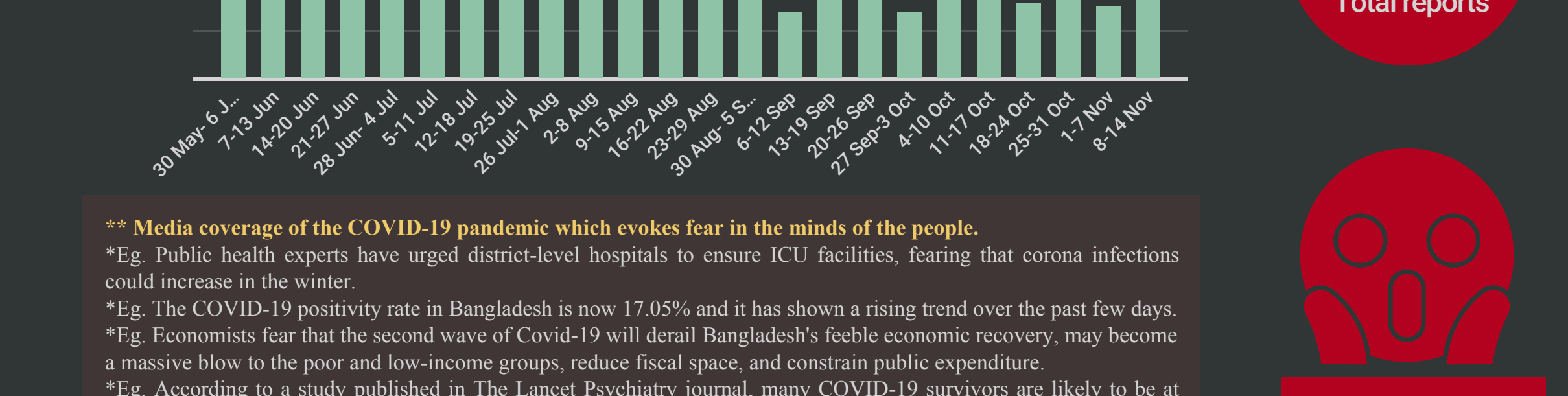

*Weekly Trend: Protest (1) associated with the COVID-19 pandemic is steadily on the decline from 1 November 2020 to 14 November 2020. *Eg.: Several hundred students from various medical and dental colleges blocked the Shahbagh intersection in the capital for over two hours, demanding the introduction of online classes, no exam amid the pandemic, and no fees for the last seven months for medical students. Report on Fear related to COVID-19 (30 May - 14 November)



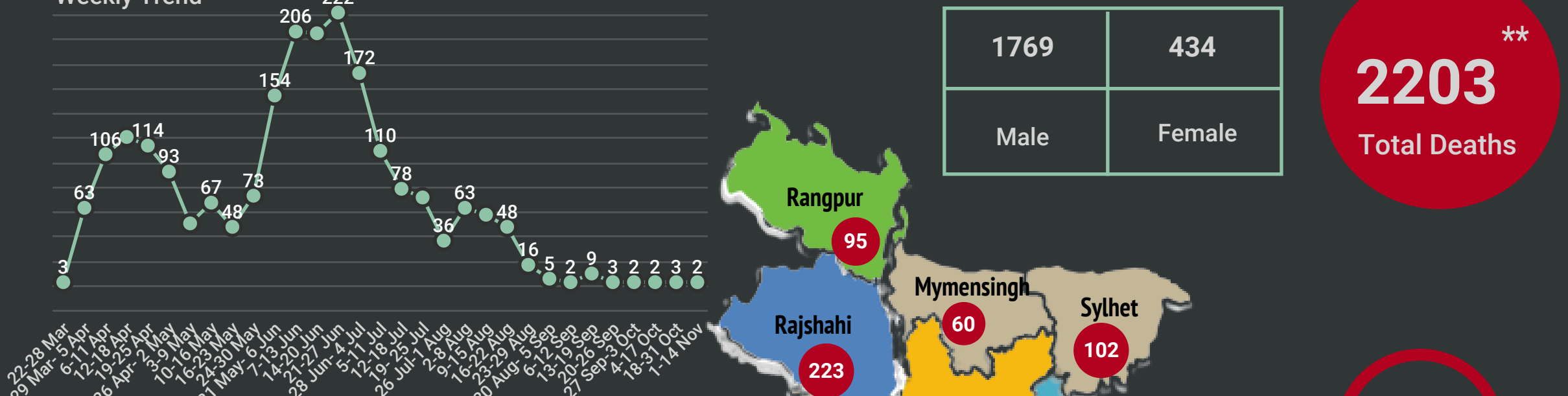
** Media coverage of the COVID-19 pandemic which evokes fear in the minds of the people. *Eg. Public health experts have urged district-level hospitals to ensure ICU facilities, fearing that corona infections could increase in the winter. *Eg. The COVID-19 positivity rate in Bangladesh is now 17.05% and it has shown a rising trend over the past few days. *Eg. Economists fear that the second wave of Covid-19 will derail Bangladesh's feasible economic recovery, may become a massive blow to the poor and low-income groups, reduce fiscal space, and constrain public expenditure. *Eg. According to a study published in The Lancet Psychiatry journal, many COVID-19 survivors are likely to be at greater risk of developing mental illness. The study found that 20% of those infected with coronavirus are diagnosed with a psychiatric disorder within 90 days.

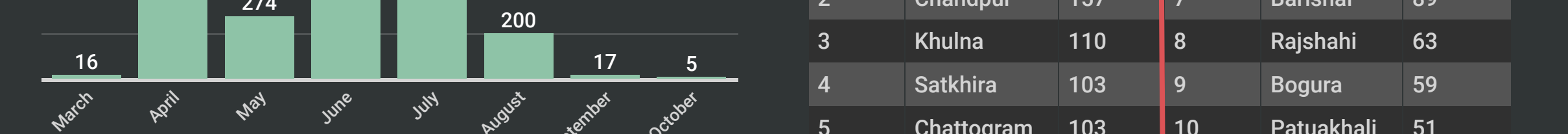

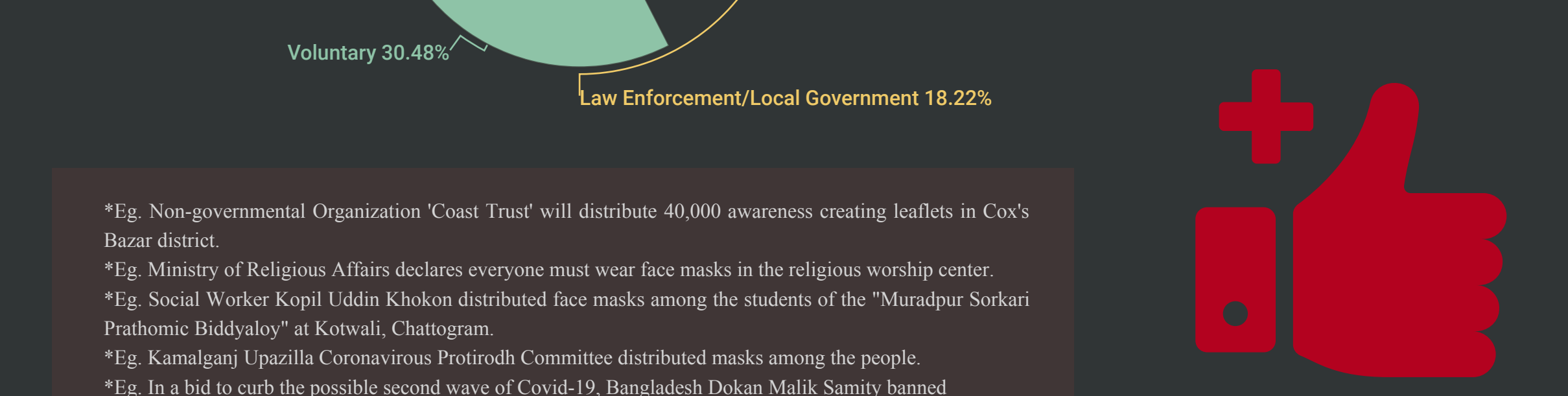

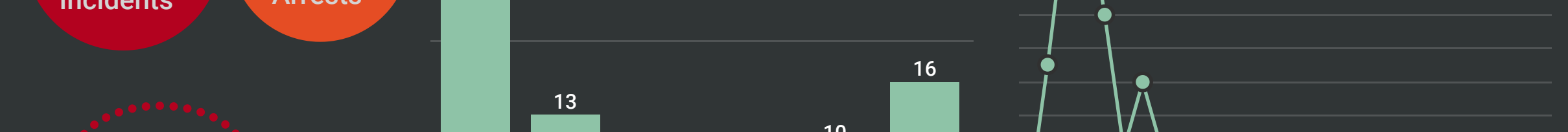
Resilience by Actors



*Eg. Non-governmental Organization 'Coast Trust' will distribute 40,000 awareness leaflets in Cox's Bazar district. *Eg. Ministry of Religious Affairs declares everyone must wear face masks in the religious worship center. *Eg. Social Worker Kopil Uddin Khokon distributed face masks among the students of the "Muradpur Sarkari Kramon Bidyaloy" at Kotwali, Chattogram. *Eg. Kamalganj Upazila Coronavirus Protocol Committee distributed masks among the people. *Eg. In a bid to curb the possible second wave of Covid-19, Bangladesh Dokaan Malik Samity banned customers without masks from all markets, shops, and malls. *Eg. Bangladesh has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Serum Institute of India in order to receive 3 crore doses of Oxford-AstraZeneca's coronavirus vaccine.

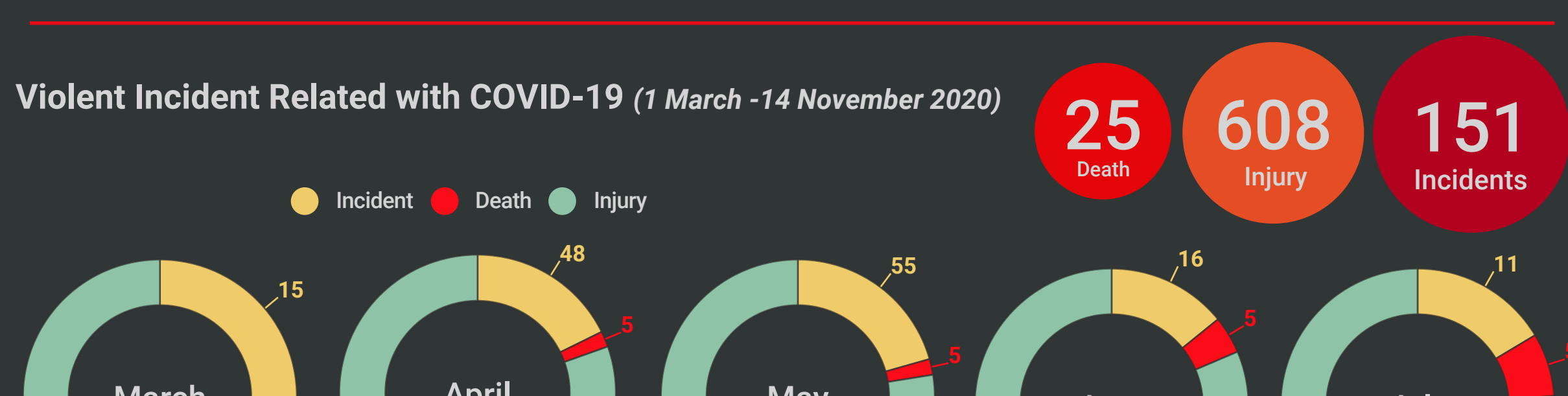
Division wise Rumor Related Arrests
