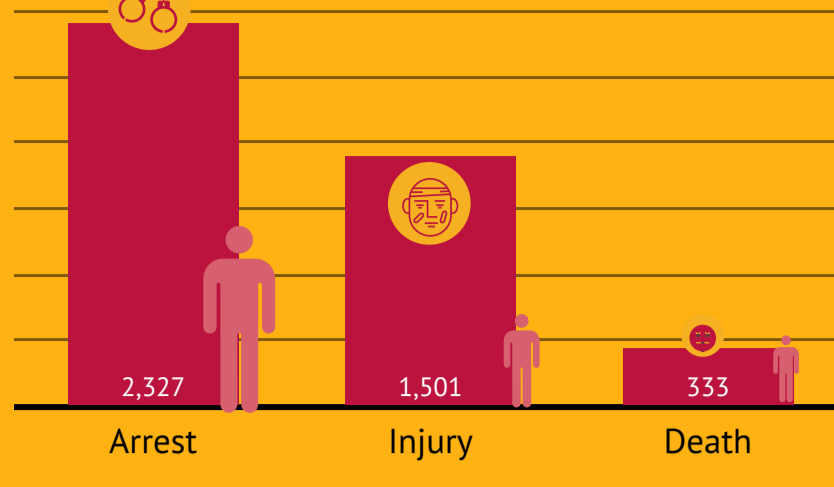
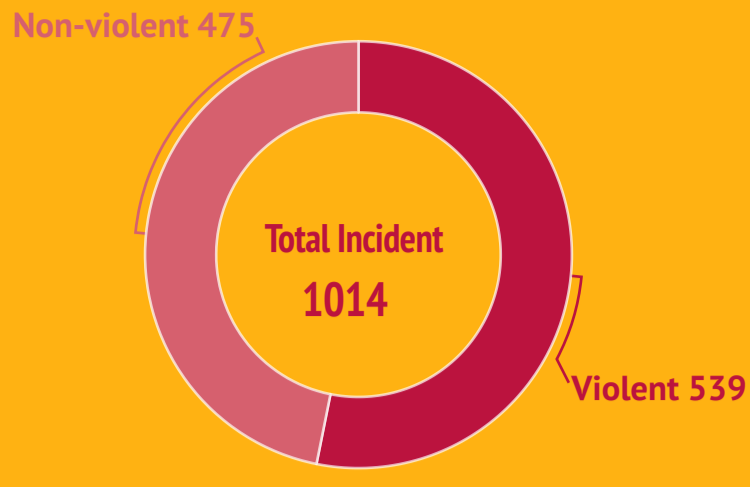

*According to BPO Codebook, "Violent incidents" are those reported incidents that "involved the intentional use of physical force by an individual or group against another individual or group, in a manner that resulted or could have resulted in death, injury or any other form of physical harm to persons or property." According to BPO Codebook, "Non-violent incidents" are those reported incidents that "did not involve the intentional use of physical force by an individual or group against another individual or group, in a manner that resulted or could have resulted in death, injury or any other form of physical harm to persons or property, e.g. arrest, peaceful protest, rescue, and recovery."

Barishal has the highest incident rates*

E.g. A teenage girl was gang-raped and later murdered by a group of miscreants in Noakhali.
E.g. A six years old girl was raped by her neighbor at Sunamganj Sadar Upazila, Sunamganj. Police arrested the perpetrator.
E.g. A 16-year-old girl was gang-raped by five men in Natore Sadar Upazila and the incident was recorded to claim ransom later. Five accused were arrested.

E.g. Hafsa Akhter, 9, was strangled to death by her brother-in-law over a trifling issue in Kurigram. Police arrested the culprit.
