COVID-19 Prevention Tips



WASH

Wash your hands frequently using soap for at least 20 seconds or sanitise them using alcohol-based handrub.



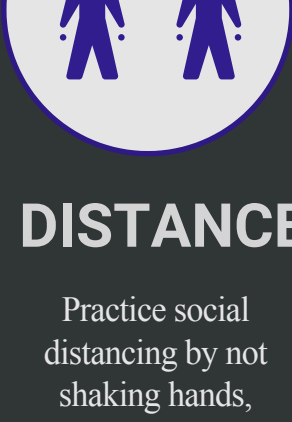
COVER

Practice social distancing by not shaking hands, hugging, etc.



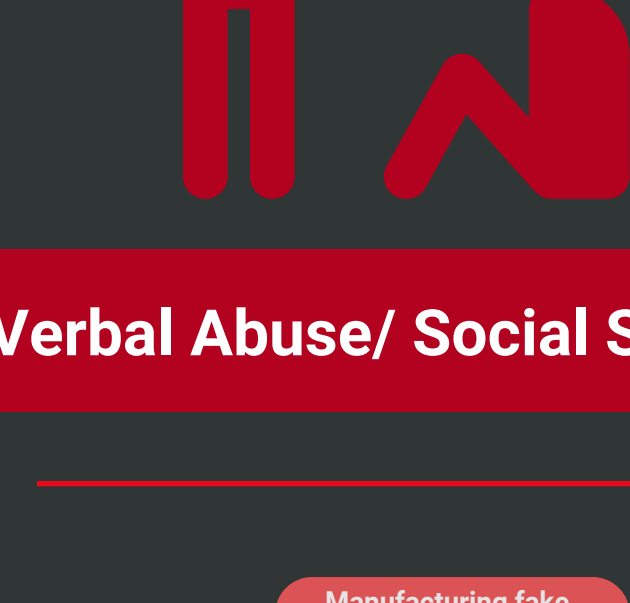
ISOLATE

Stay at home if you become ill and help prevent its spread.

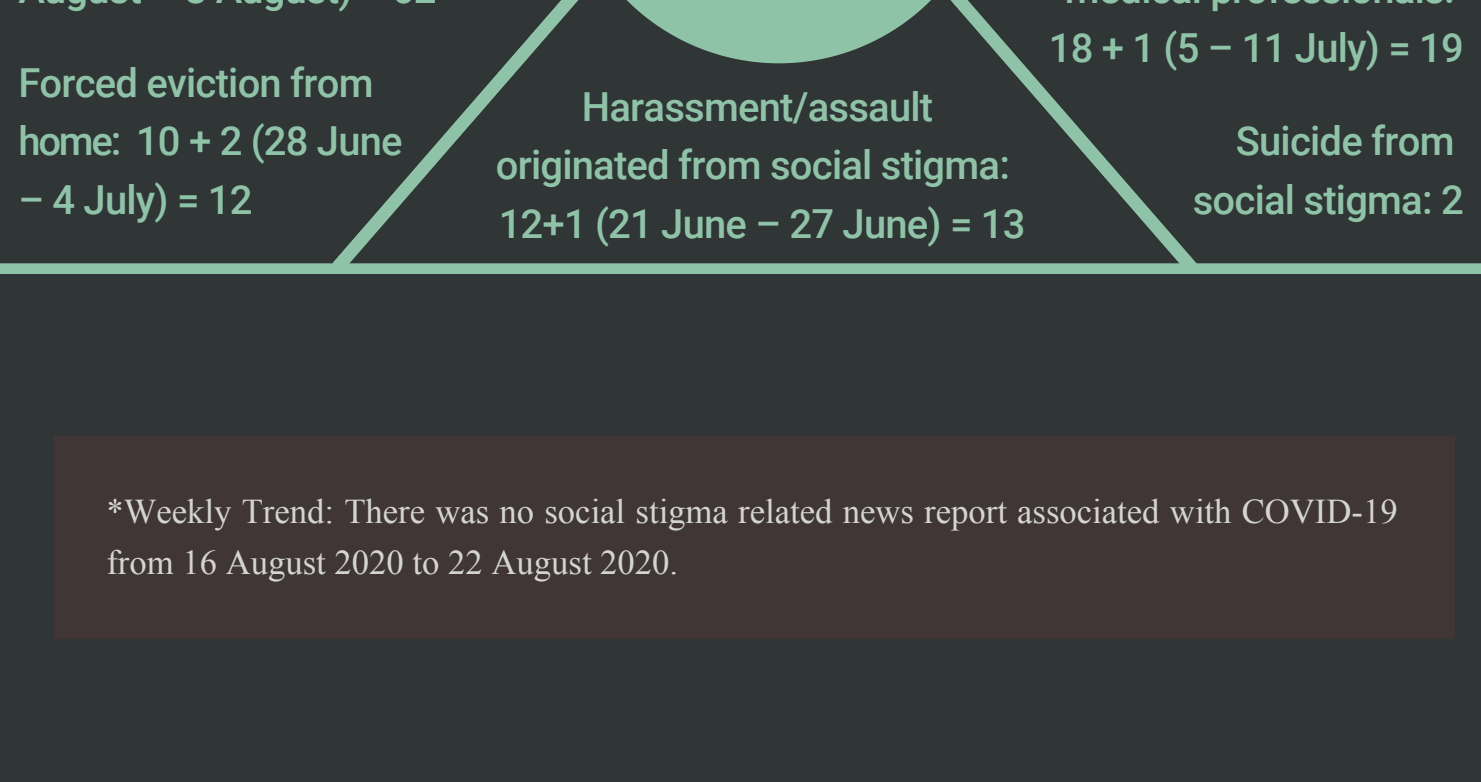
Covid-19 Related Incident Mapping in Bangladesh

*Out of 206 fine cases, almost 22% of them are filed against drivers and vehicle owners this week for violating health rules and transportation rules.

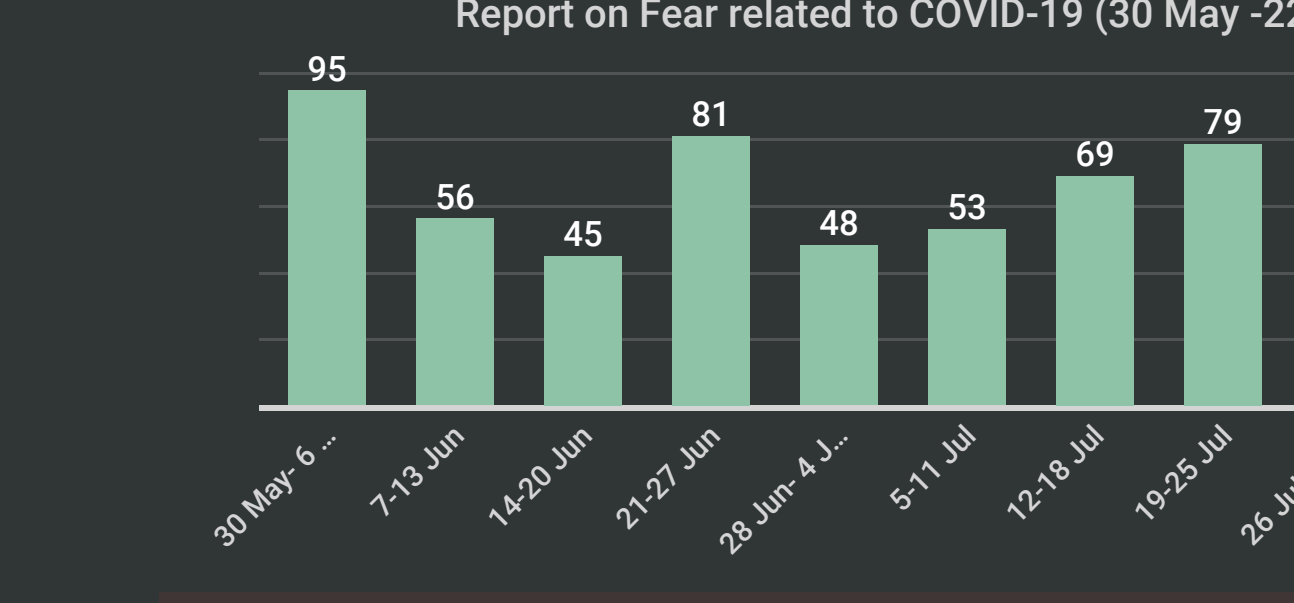

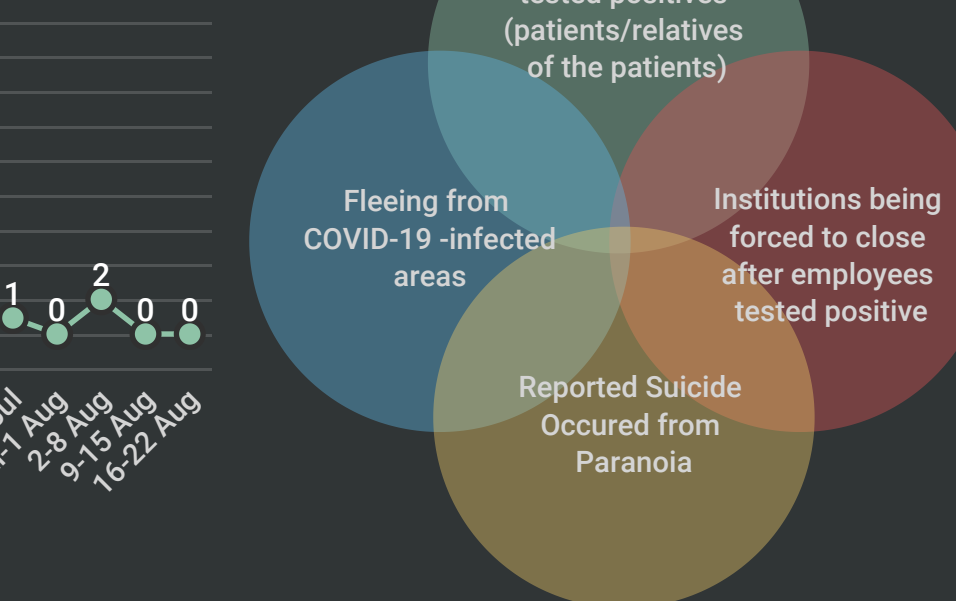
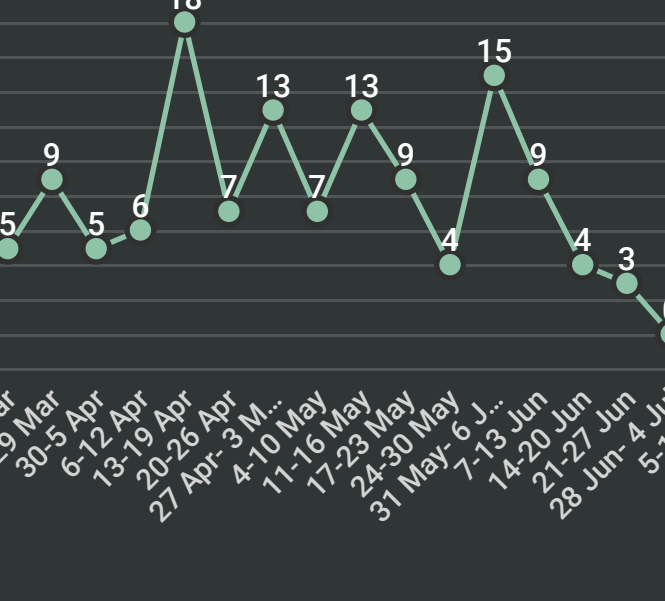

** Media coverage of COVID-19 pandemic which evokes fear in the minds of the people.
*Eg. ADB and ILO jointly published a report, titled "Tackling the COVID-19 youth employment crisis in Asia and the Pacific," that 1.7 million Bangladeshi youths aged between 15 and 24 have lost their jobs as a consequence of the coronavirus pandemic.
*Eg. World Bank president David Malpas warned that the coronavirus pandemic may have driven as many as 100 million people back into extreme poverty. He also said "that number could go higher" if the pandemic worsens or drags on.
*Eg. The World Health Organization (WHO) expressed concern over the spread of coronavirus among young people in the Asia-Pacific region. Especially among young people who did not have symptoms after being infected, they pose a greater threat to people at health risk.

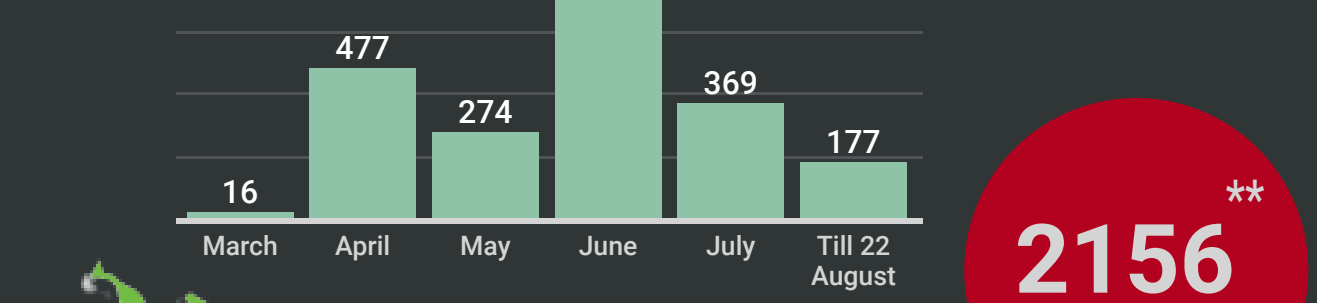
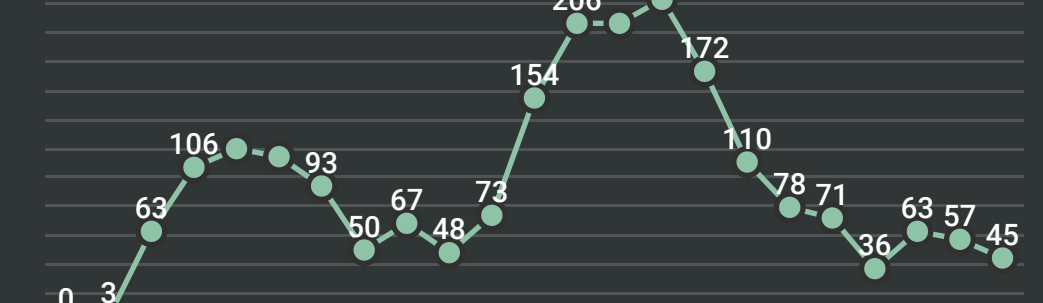

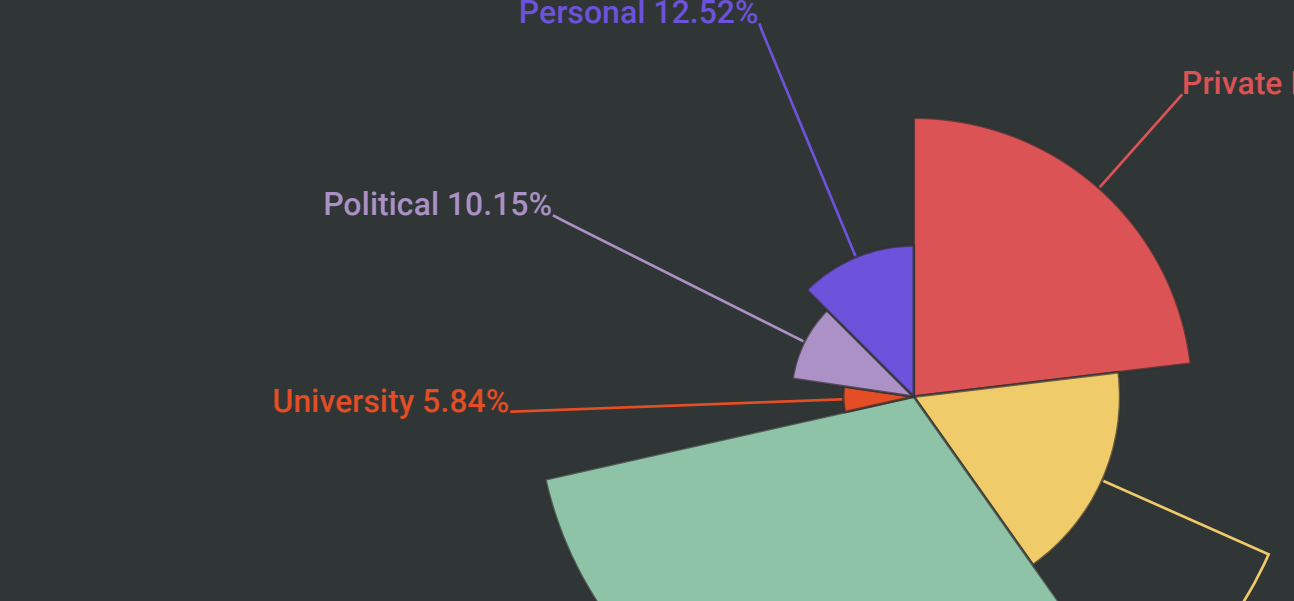

COVID-like Symptoms***



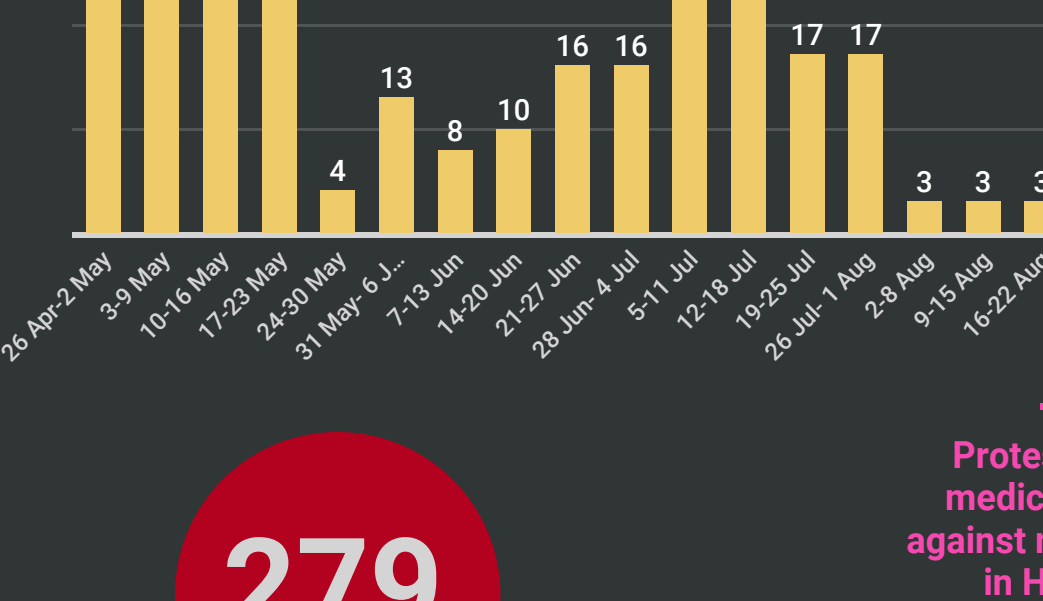

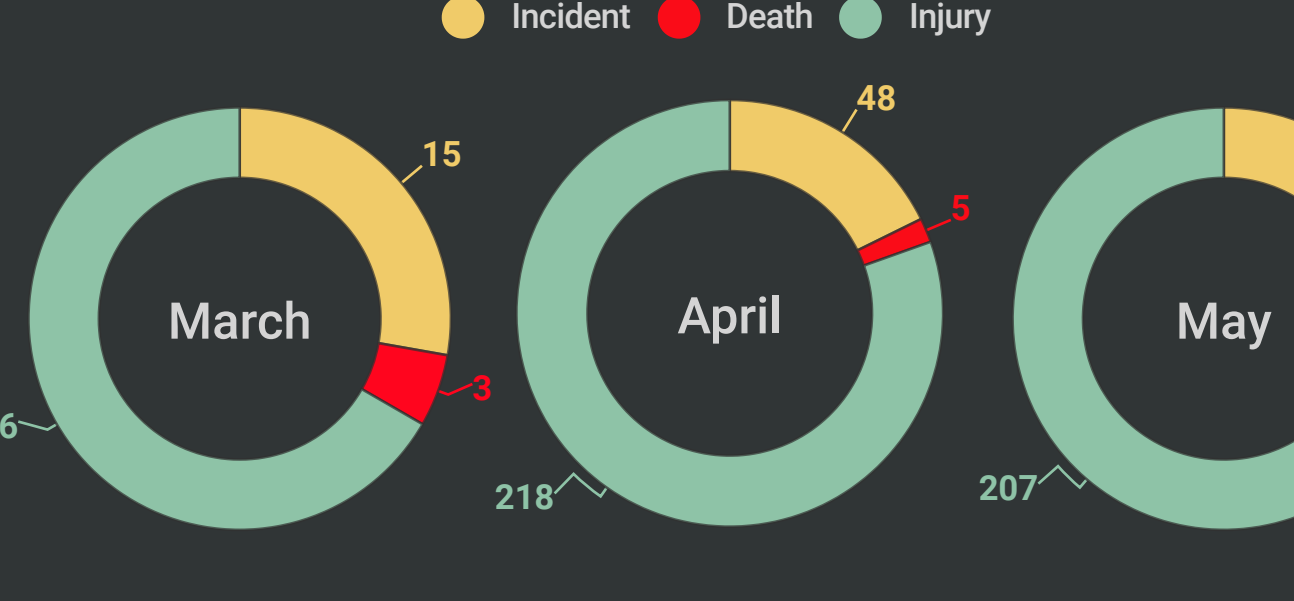

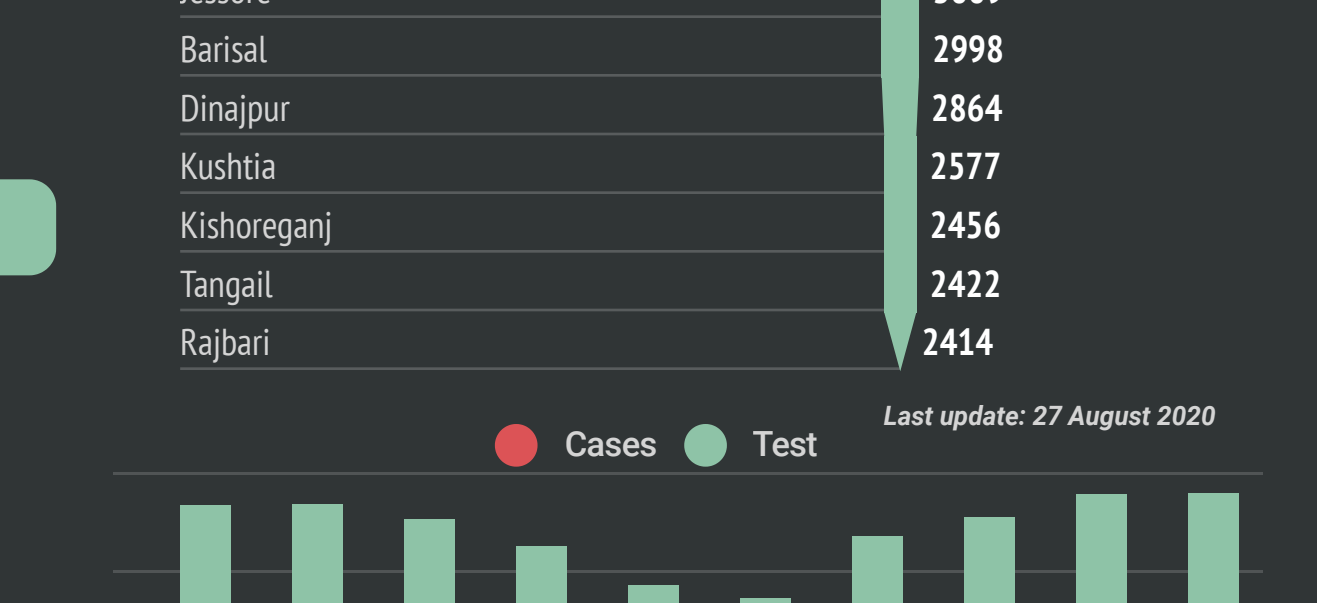
