## COVID-19 Prevention Tips



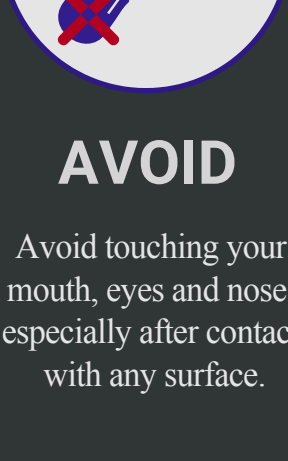
### WASH

Wash your hands frequently using soap for at least 20 seconds or sanitise them using alcohol-based handrub.



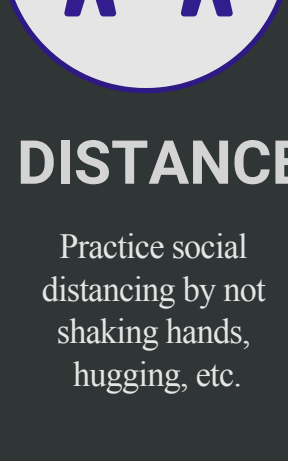
### COVER

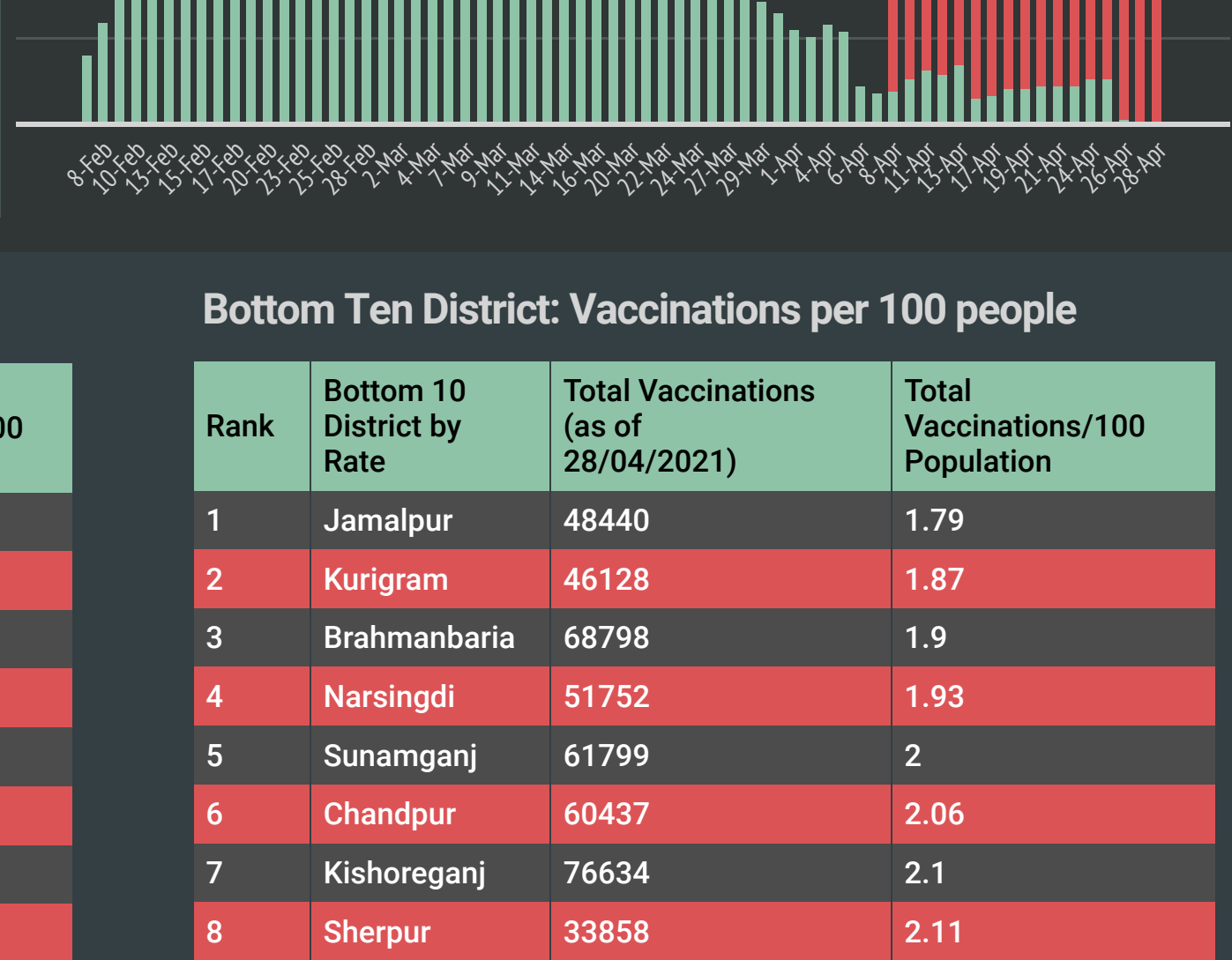

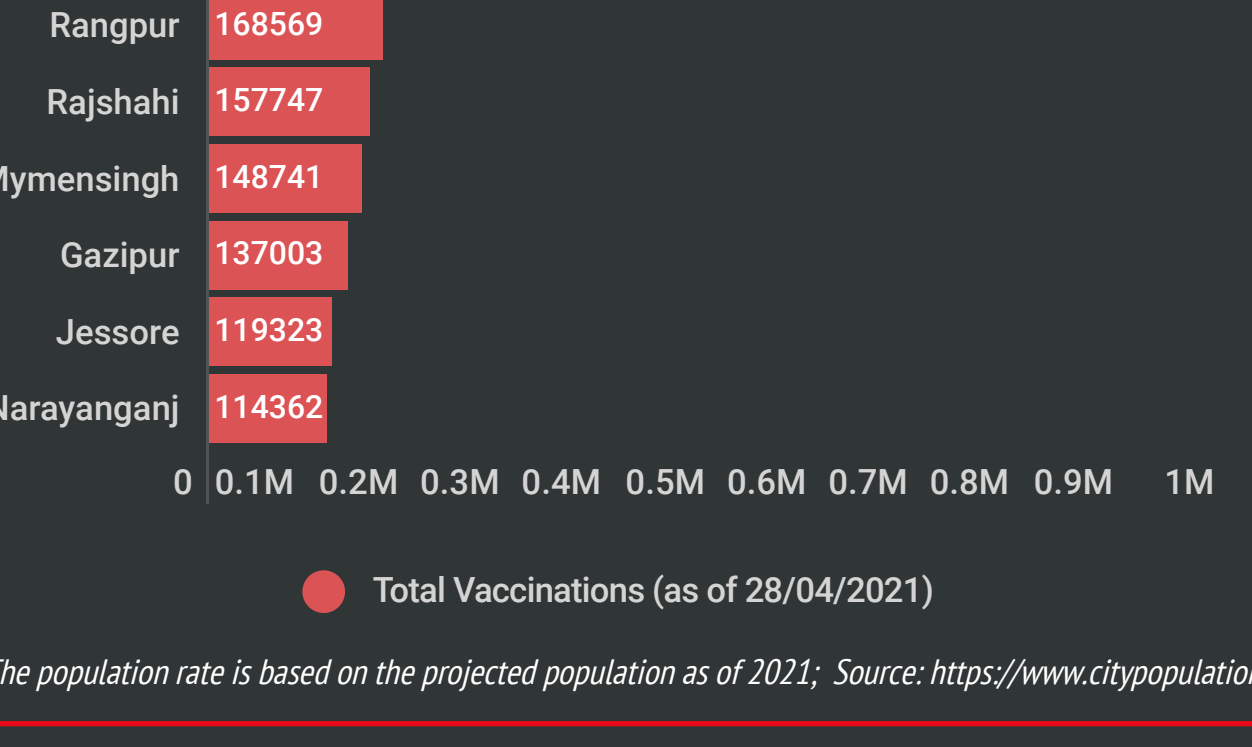

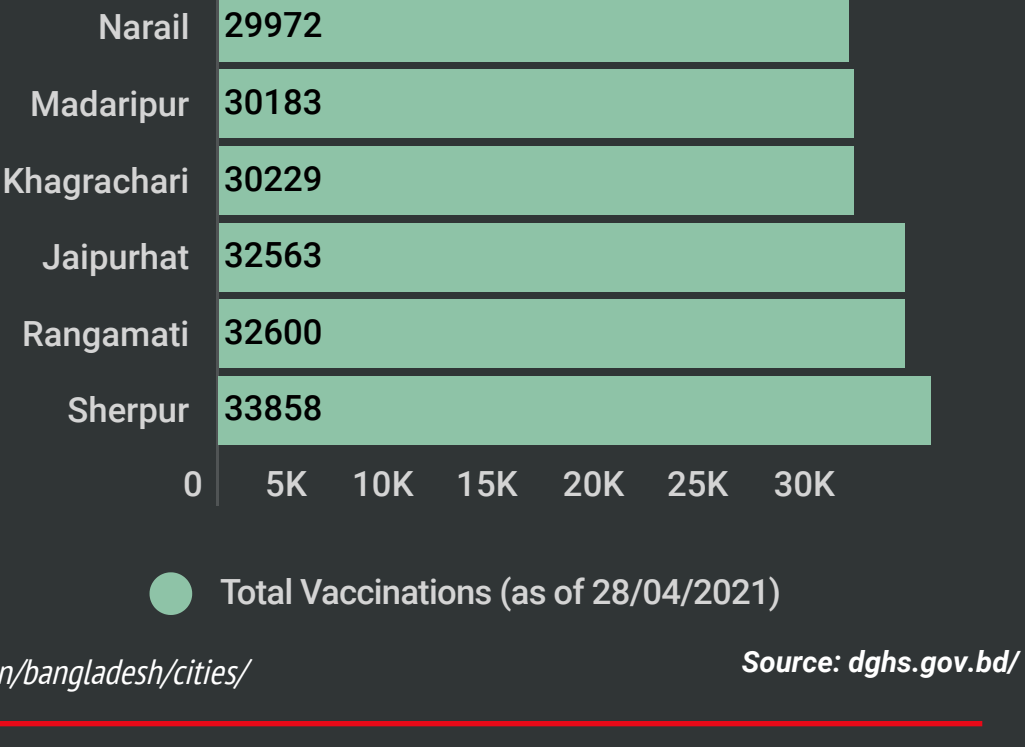

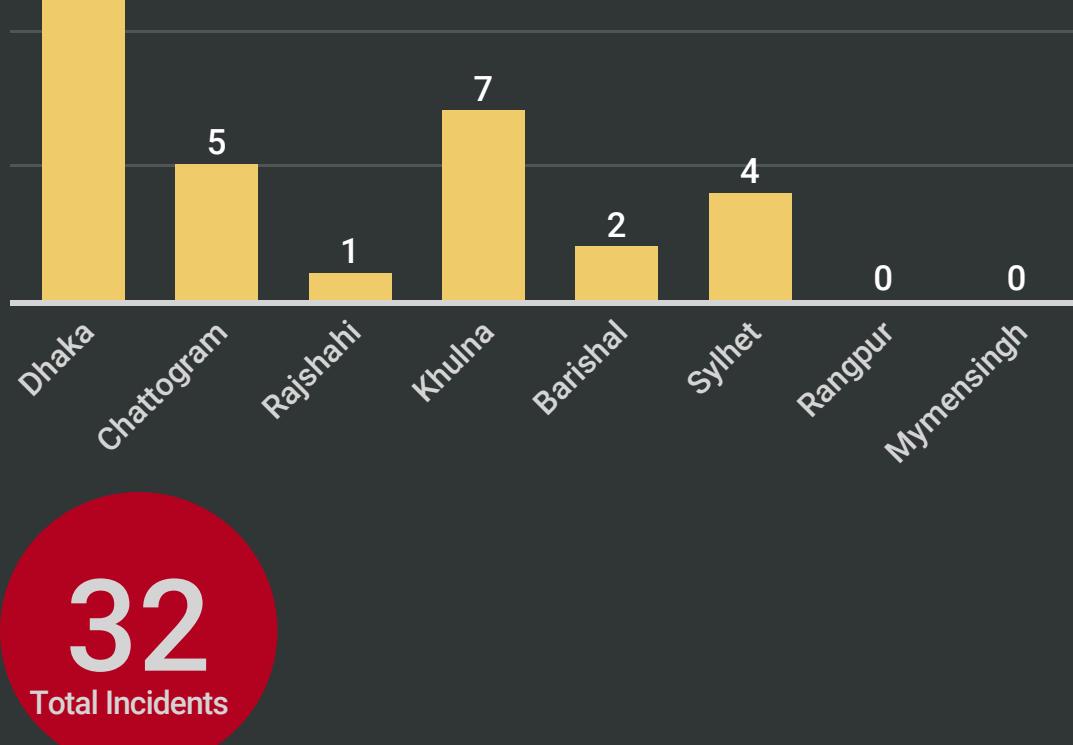

### Protest

\*Seven protests related to the COVID-19 pandemic were recorded from 13 April 2021 to 26 April 2021, a sharp decline from 29 March 2021 to 12 April 2021.

\* At least 500 rickshaw-pullers took part in a procession demanding ration and relief during the lockdown that started from Ashiwni Kumar Hall at Barishal Sadar, organised by Bangladesher Samajtantrik Dal and its workers' front.

\*\*Shomatantrik Sramik Front, Khulna did a human chain and demanded relief for the rickshaw and easy-bike drivers at Khulna Sadar, Khulna. It also demanded to stop the harassment against them during the lockdown.

\*Around 200 Saudi Arabia-bound migrant workers staged a protest inside the Dhaka airport early on 17 April 2021 morning after a scheduled special flight of Biman Bangladesh to Riyadh was cancelled at the last minute.

\* Chattogram Sarak Paribahan Sramik Federation brings out human chain demands of lifting the lockdown on public transport.

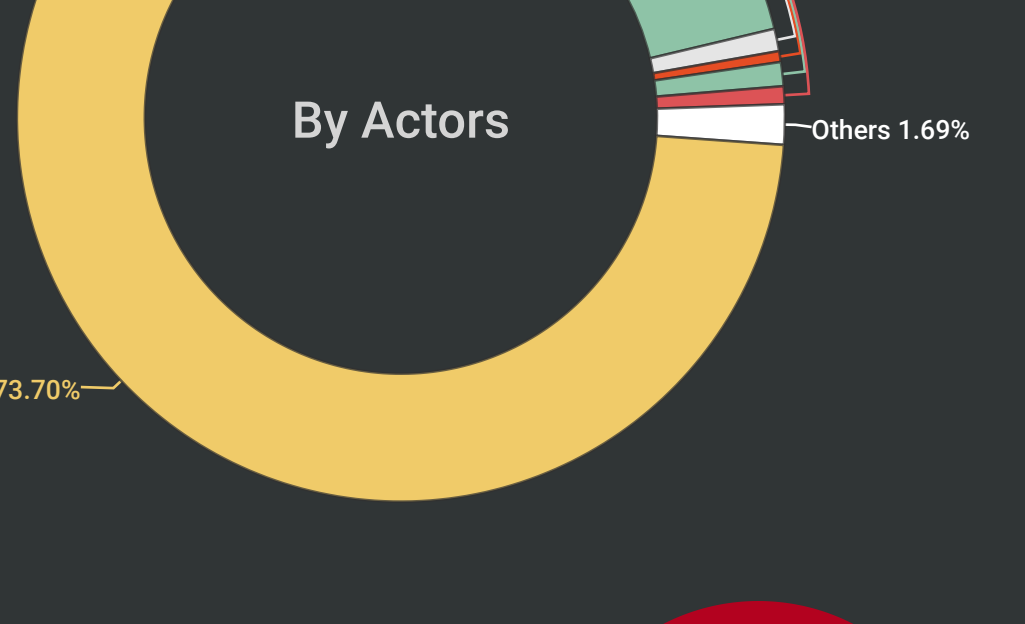

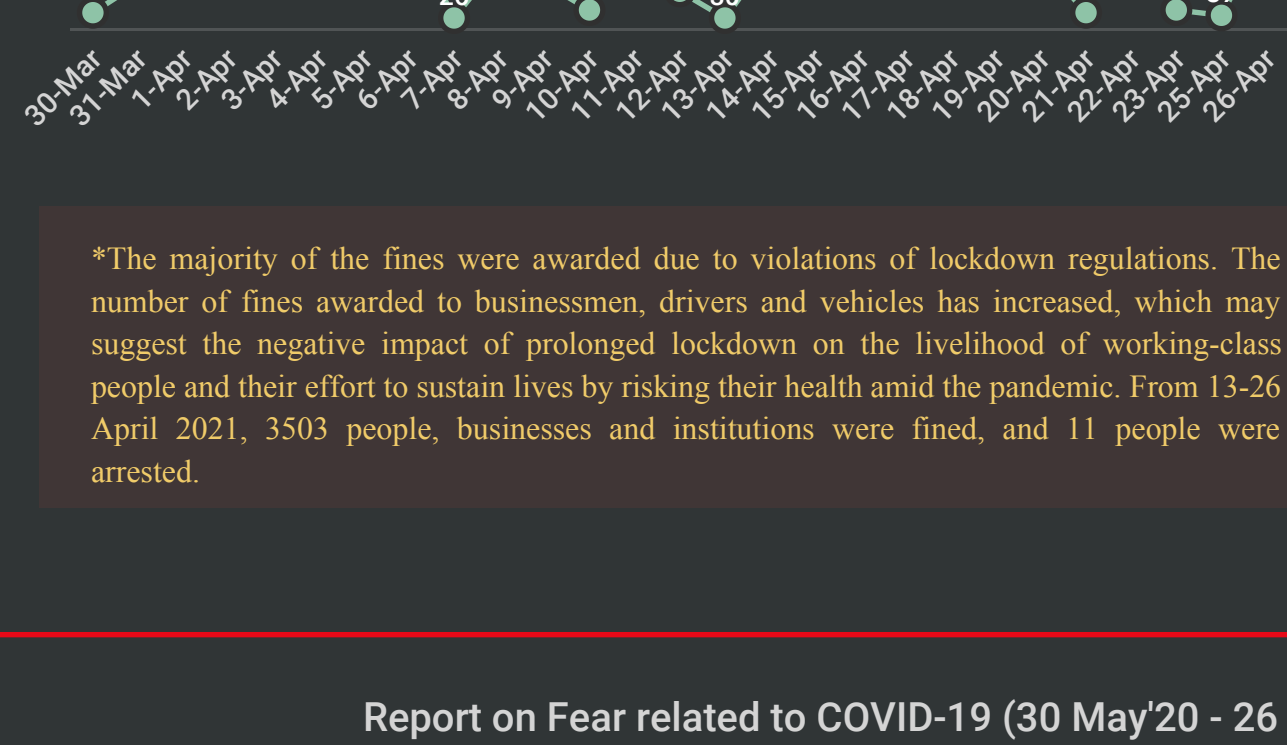

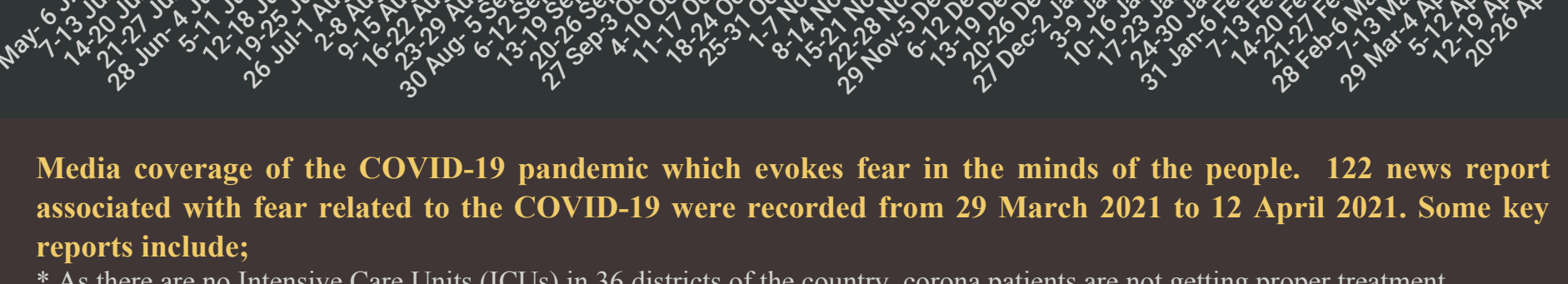
### Daily Trend (Number of Individuals Fined/ Penalized)

\*The majority of the fines were awarded due to violations of lockdown regulations. The number of fines awarded to businessmen, drivers and vehicles has increased, which may suggest the negative impact of prolonged lockdown on the livelihood of working-class people and their effort to sustain lives by risking their health amid the pandemic. From 13-26 April 2021, 3503 people, businesses and institutions were fined, and 11 people were arrested.

Media coverage of the COVID-19 pandemic which evokes fear in the minds of the people. 122 news report associated with fear related to the COVID-19 were recorded from 29 March 2021 to 12 April 2021. Some key reports include:

\*According to Bangladesh Medical Association (BMA), a total of 139 doctors died of COVID-19 in the last year and 2911 doctors infected with the virus across the country.

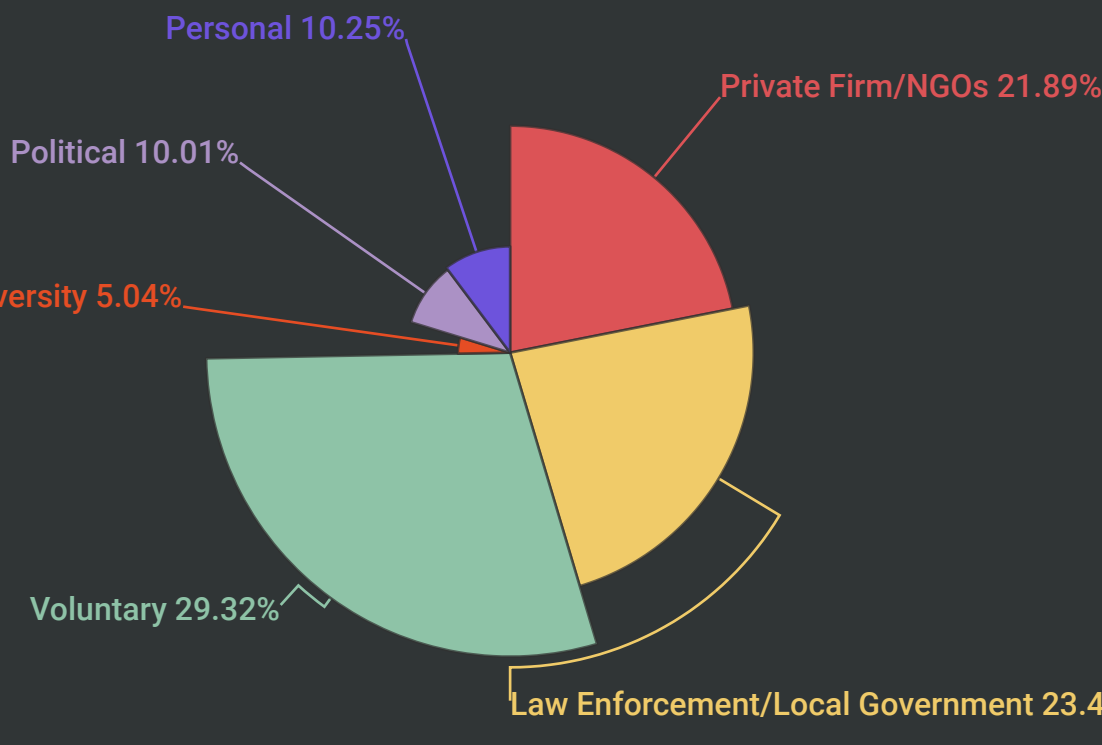
